KIM DAMERON
(Arkansas, 1983) -- 4th Season (Career Record 18-17, 16-8 OVC)

Kim Dameron was hired as the 24th head coach in program history and the fifth in the NCAA Division I era in January of 2014.

In 2016 the Panthers quickly climbed into the FCS playoff picture as they knocked off FBS member Miami (Ohio) and beat No. 5 ranked Illinois State in the Mid-America Classic. Dameron would guide EIU to a No. 13 ranking in the polls at the midway portion of the season. The Panthers would face several key injuries late in the season and finished the year at 6-5 overall following a 24-0 win at Eastern Kentucky to end the season. EIU was 4-4 in the OVC. The Panthers had four players earn All-OVC honors with Devin Church and Seth McDonald both earning first team honors.

Dameron returned the Panthers to the FCS playoffs in 2015 as EIU won seven of their last eight regular season games to finish with a 7-4 regular season record. EIU lost in the opening round of the FCS playoffs at Northern Iowa. The Panthers were ranked No. 23 in the final FCS Coaches poll after making their 16th all-time FCS playoff appearance. During the season Dameron's team produced six All-OVC players including co-Defensive Player of the Year Dino Fanti. Dameron would have his first player from Eastern Illinois drafted in May of 2016 when linebacker Kamu Grugier-Hill became a sixth round selection of the New England Patriots.

In his first season Dameron coached the Panthers to a 5-7 record including 5-3 in the Ohio Valley Conference as the Panthers were in the championship race until the final weeks of the season. Dameron's first career victory came on Sept. 20 against Austin Peay as the Panthers won 63-7. In the game EIU tied a school record for rushing yards with 413. The team featured three All-American selections including first team offensive lineman Collin Seibert and freshman All-American kicker Nick Bruno. Dameron's squad had five first team All-OVC selections and five second team All-OVC honorees. The team was among the best on both sides of the ball in the OVC ranking second in total offense (11th nationally) and third in total defense.

Dameron spent the 2013 season as the defensive coordinator at Louisiana Tech where he directed a much improved defensive unit. The Bulldogs finished ranked 69th in the nation in total defense under Dameron's direction after being ranked 120th the previous season. Dameron's defense was the fourth most-improved squad in the FBS last season.

An experienced defensive coach with more than 15 years as a defensive coordinator Dameron took over an Eastern Illinois program that advanced to the FCS playoff quarterfinals last season. It is Dameron's second stint in Charleston as he previously worked as the defensive coordinator at EIU in 2000 as a member of head coach Bob Spoo's staff. During that 2000 season, Dameron helped transform the Panthers defense as they rebounded from a 2-10 season in 1999 to 8-4 and Ohio Valley Conference Champions in 2000.

Dameron spent three seasons as the safeties coach at Ole Miss as the team appeared in two Cotton Bowls. Two of his players were selected in the NFL draft as his pass defense unit ranked 11th in the NCAA in pass efficiency defense and 15th in pass defense.

Prior to his stint at Ole Miss, Dameron was the defensive coordinator at Louisiana-Monroe as the program became bowl eligible at the FBS level for the first time in 2007 while also picking up a win over Alabama. The ULM defense led the Sun Belt Conference in fewest points allowed and ranking third nationally in turnovers gained.

Dameron has previous stops as the defensive coordinator at Stephen F. Austin and as the secondary coach at Cincinnati and UNLV. He spent the 1999 season as the secondary coach in the Canadian Football League with the Toronto Argonauts.

He has previous FCS coaching experience on the staffs of Murray State and Missouri State where he helped coach both teams to FCS playoff appearances.

Dameron began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Lou Holtz at Arkansas, his alma mater, after earning his degree. He was a four-year player for the Razorbacks from 1979-82 at wide receiver and defensive

GREG STEVENS
 Assistant Head Coach

Greg Stevens is in his fourth season on head coach Kim Dameron's Eastern Illinois staff. Stevens is the Panthers assistant head coach serving as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

Stevens made an immediate impact on the EIU offense but as dynamic as his offensive statistics may have been, the personal victory for Stevens was even more impressive. Stevens was a finalist for the Rare Disease Champion Award presented by Uplifting Athletes. During the season Stevens battled non-Hodgkin's large B-cell lymphoma after being diagnosed with the condition in June of 2014. He underwent chemotherapy treatments that lasted until early October, but during the process Stevens never missed a practice or a game. During the offseason he underwent a bone marrow transplant. Stevens was also a finalist for the Giant Steps Award.

Stevens and the EIU offense overcame many obstacles during his second season as the Panthers needed a couple of games to find their rhythm. The start of the offense clicking came in an overtime loss to No. 5 Illinois State. The following week EIU beat Austin Peay 40-16 as the Panthers won seven of eight OVC games. The offensive line came together finishing the year a streak of 636 consecutive snaps without allowing a quarterback sack. Devin Church earned All-OVC second team honors leading the Panthers in both rushing and pass receptions. The Panthers were once again balanced on offense with only seven yards separating their average of rushing and passing yards per game.

The Panthers offense was once again balanced during the 2016 season as EIU ranked third in the OVC in total offense (38th in the nation). Senior running back Devin Church led the OVC in rushing and touchdowns scored as he earned first team All-OVC honors. The Panthers were able to put together a game-winning drive to beat FBS member Miami (Ohio) and then jumped out for a win over No. 5 ranked Illinois State in the Mid-America Classic Rivalry game. The Panthers offense featured transfer quarterback Mitch Kimble who earned All-OVC Newcomer team honors and ranked fifth in the OVC in touchdown passes despite missing a portion of the season due to injury.

In his first season at EIU, Stevens brought a high powered, balanced offensive attack that finished the season ranked 13th in the FCS in total offense at 480.1 yards per game. EIU was ranked 11th in the country in rushing offense (236.3 ypg) and 38th in scoring offense at 31.3 points per game. The offense compiled more than 600 yards of total offense in two games and tied the school record for rushing yards in a game with 413 against Austin Peay. EIU finished the season with the second highest number of yards for total offense (5,761) in school history. Individually, Stevens coached an offensive unit that featured two All-Americans and six All-OVC selections. Quarterback Jalen Whitlow was named a second team All-OVC performer after setting the school record for rushing yards by a quarterback in a game, rushing yards by a quarterback in a season and consecutive passes thrown without an interception.

Prior to coming to EIU Stevens worked two seasons as the offensive coordinator at Southeastern Louisiana for head coach Ron Roberts. In 2013 his offensive unit ranked 10th in the nation in total offense averaging 483.3 yards per game as the Lions advanced to the FCS playoff quarterfinal round. SELA's offense ranked 12th in the nation in scoring at 38.4 points per game and was in the top 30 in both rushing and passing offense. The Lions 42 rushing touchdowns were third most in the FCS.

In his first season at Southeastern Louisiana, Stevens helped in the development of quarterback Nathan Stanley who earned post-season berths in the East-West Shrine Game and Casino del Sol Collegiate All-Star Classic.

Stevens went to SELA as part of Ron Roberts staff after a successful two-year run at NCAA Division II member Delta State. During the two seasons the Statesmen advanced to the NCAA Division II playoff semifinals one season and lost in the NCAA Division II National Championship game the other season.

Stevens Delta State offenses ranked 12th in the NCAA in both seasons as he mentored Micah Davis as the quarterback placed third in the Harlon Hill Trophy voting – the Division II equivalent of the Heisman Trophy. During his tenure at DSU, Stevens squads set several school records including passing for 4,166 yards as 16 different receivers caught passes during that season. He helped coach three-time All-American Trevar Deed as Deed became the first player in Gulf South Conference history to finish his career with 2,000 yards rushing and 2,000 yards receiving.

From 2005-08, Stevens worked as the wide receivers coach at Utah State working with the school's career leading receiver All-American Kevin Robinson.

Stevens began his association with Coach Kim Dameron while serving as the offensive coordinator at Stephen F. Austin from 2002-04. While at SFA his offensive unit led the Southland Conference in passing two seasons and ranked 36th in the nation in 2004.

Stevens worked three seasons as the offensive coordinator at NCAA Division II Arkansas Monticello helping the school set 30 offensive records and rank in the top five in the nation in total offense.

He has additional coaching stops at Mesa State (1992-94), Eastern Arizona (1995-97) and Snow (Utah) Junior College (1998).

Stevens played quarterback at Snow Junior College concluding his career at Eastern Oregon. He is a 1992 graduate of Eastern Oregon.

Stevens and his wife Amy have three children – Tyler, Ryan and Hannah.

Cary Fowler joined head coach Kim Dameron's Eastern Illinois football staff in March of 2017 and serves as the Panthers defensive coordinator.

Fowler comes to EIU following a one-year stint as the defensive coordinator at Howard Payne University in Texas.

Prior to his time at Howard Payne, Fowler spent eight seasons at Tarleton State. He began his time at Tarleton State as the defensive coordinator in 2008 and 2009 helping the team reach the second round of the NCAA Division II playoffs in 2009. He was hired as the program's head coach in 2010 and coached six seasons with a record of 30-32. He coached the team to a co-championship of the Lone Star Conference in 2013 finishing with a 7-3 record.

No stranger to the Lone Star Conference, Fowler spent seven seasons as the defensive coordinator at Midwestern State. He helped the program make NCAA Division II playoff appearances in 2004 and 2006. He was named the Division II Assistant Coach of the Year in 2005. Annually constructing one of the top defenses in the Lone Star Conference, Fowler coached 70 All-Americans, four Academic All-Americans and was a part of four conference championship teams.

Fowler played at Ohio Valley Conference member Murray State in the early 1990's and began his coaching career with the Racers as a position coach from 1995-2000.

He is a 1994 graduate of Murray State. He and his wife Shanan have two daughters, Sophi and Bella.

Greg Carroll joined head coach Kim Dameron's Eastern Illinois staff as a full-time member after working as a graduate assistant and defensive quality control in 2015. In addition to helping on the defensive side of the ball, Carroll helped oversee the Panthers film exchange.

During his first full-time season on staff in 2016, Carroll coached the Huskies group which featured two of the Panthers top tacklers on the season in Bradley Dewberry and Pono Choy. That group combined for three interceptions and four forced fumbles including one returned for a touchdown by Choy at Southeast Missouri.

Carroll began his coaching career as a student assistant coach under EIU head coach Dino Babers working with both the offensive and defensive staffs as the Panthers won back-to-back Ohio Valley Conference Championships in 2012 and 2013.

He remained as a student-assistant coach in 2014 under Coach Dameron earning his degree from EIU in 2015.

Kwahn Drake joined head coach Kim Dameron's Eastern Illinois football staff in February 2017. Drake will serve as the defensive line coach for the Panthers.

Drake spent the 2016 season as an offensive analyst for Memphis under head coach Mike Norvell. Memphis posted an 8-5 record on the season playing in the Boca Raton Bowl.

Prior to that Drake coached for two seasons as the defensive line coach at Tulane under head coach Curtis Johnson. His defensive line group helped the Green Wave rank 12th in the FBS in tackles for loss per game during the 2015 season. He coached defensive tackle Tanzel Smart and defensive end Royce LaFrance as the pair ranked first and second in tackles for loss at Tulane. Drake also spent two seasons as a defensive graduate assistant coach with Tulane.

A respected New Orleans recruiter, Drake coached two seasons as the defensive line coach at St. Augustine High in New Orleans helping the school win back-to-back District Championships. He served as the program's recruiting coordinator and academic advisor helping 25 players sign NCAA Division I football scholarships. He coached the 2009 season as the defensive line coach at St. James (La.) High School.

A 2009 graduate of Nicholls State, Drake began his coaching career as a student-assistant at his alma mater working with the defensive line and on scouting reports. He earned his master's degree from Tulane in 2013.

Alvah Hansbro joined coach Kim Dameron's Eastern Illinois staff in March of 2017 and coaches cornerbacks.

Hansbro coached corners last season at Maine with a third team All-Colonial Athletic Conference selection. The Black Bears posted a 6-5 record including a 5-3 record in the CAA.

Prior to his one season at Maine spent two seasons on the staff at Syracuse as a defensive quality control coach.

He coached from 2012-14 at Glenville State College in West Virginia where he coached the 2013 statistical NCAA leader in passes defended serving as the secondary coach. He oversaw the development of three two-time all-conference selections and one second team All-American.

Hansbro coached the secondary at the University of Dubuque in Iowa from 2009-10. He had one all-conference defensive back selection.

A three-year starter at cornerback and four-year starter on special teams from 2003-06. He would begin his coaching career as a student coach at NIU helping coach the secondary.

Hansbro began his full-time coaching career in the prep ranks as the co-defensive coordinator at Edgewood High School in Wisconsin during the 2009 season. He coached eight all-conference players that season.

He began his career on the Hawaii staff in 2012 serving as the running backs coach prior to moving into an administrative role. In his only season at Utah, Uperesa coached first-team all-conference pick Chris Kemoeatu and also worked with current NFL quarterback Alex Smith and three-time national champion head coach Urban Meyer.

Prior to Utah, Uperesa spent one year at El Camino Community College, guiding the squad to the Verizon Southern California Bowl Championship.

From 2001-02, Uperesa was part of the USC staff where he was the offensive line coach in 2001, working with tackles and tight ends in 2002, and playing a role in leading the Trojans to 2001 Las Vegas Bowl and 2003 Orange Bowl victories.

Prior to USC, Uperesa served as the offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at Idaho State from 1999-2000. The 1999 squad was among some of the best offenses in school history—with a 3,000-yard passer, a 1,000-yard rusher and a team scoring average of 30 points per game. Idaho State finished both seasons in the Top 20 nationally in passing, including a No. 9 ranking in 1999.

Uperesa spent 12 years at Snow College where he started in 1987 as the offensive line coach. He worked his way up to head coach in 1995 and compiled a 35-8 record in five seasons until 1999. He guided Snow College to four consecutive Top 10 rankings and four straight bowl victories.

Uperesa's coaching career began as a graduate assistant for his alma mater BYU from 1985-86. In his two seasons, BYU played in the Florida Citrus Bowl in 1985 and the Freedom Bowl in 1986.

Uperesa is a graduate of Punahou School where he starred in football and later was an all-Western Athletic Conference offensive tackle for BYU from 1974-77. He played in the 1977 Hula Bowl and Blue-Gray Classic. Following his collegiate career, he played three seasons in the NFL for the Oakland Raiders (1978) and Denver Broncos (1979-80).

Now in its 69th year, the Ohio Valley Conference continues to build on the success that has made it the nation's eighth-oldest NCAA Division I conference.

In May 2011 the Conference expanded for the second time in four years, adding Belmont University which begins competition in the 2012-13 academic year. The addition of Belmont gives the OVC 12 members, the most the league has had at one time in its illustrious history. The move added a second team in the city of Nashville and was the first addition to the league since Southern Illinois University Edwardsville joined in 2008.

The 2009-10 school year saw a change in leadership as Beth DeBauche was named the seventh full-time Commissioner in league history on July 28, 2009. The last three commissioners of the OVC have moved onto jobs as the commissioner of the Big Ten, Big 12 and the Mid-American Conferences.

The OVC's proud past dates back to 1948, but seeds for the new league were actually planted in 1941. It was then that Roy Stewart, the athletics director at Murray State, Charles (Turkey) Hughes, the athletics director at Eastern Kentucky, and Kelly Thompson, the public relations director at Western Kentucky, first broached the idea of forming a new conference. Discussions were put on hold by World War II, but remerged Feb. 27-28, 1948 at the Kentucky Hotel in Louisville as the three original institutions combined with Morehead State, Louisville and Evansville to form the OVC.

In the 1950's, the OVC became a pioneer on a much more significant scale socially. During times of racial segregation, league member Morehead State became one of the first non-traditionally black mid-southern institutions to accept a black student. In 1958, Marshall Banks earned athletically-related aid at Morehead, which signed a second black athlete, Howard Murphy, a year later. In 1961, Murphy earned all-conference recognition as a halfback in football. With racial barriers broken, the rest of the institutions in the league began to provide educational and athletic opportunities to African-Americans.

Through the past 66 years, 15 teams have won or shared the league's football title. The list is led by Eastern Kentucky, winner of 21 outright or shared football crowns, which is tied for the most in Football Championship Subdivision history (with Massachusetts). Among OVC teams, former member Middle Tennessee is next with 11 titles, followed by Tennessee Tech with 10, and Murray State and former member Western Kentucky with eight apiece. Eastern Illinois has claimed seven football crowns and Jacksonville State has three, while Morehead State, Tennessee State and former members Evansville and East Tennessee State have captured two apiece. Austin Peay, Southeast Missouri, UT Martin and former member Youngstown State have one title apiece.

Murray State and Evansville tied for the initial football championship, and the Racers participated in the first-ever bowl game by an OVC team, tying Sul Ross State 21-21 in the 1948 Tangerine Bowl. From 1948 to 1975, OVC teams played in 15 bowl games, winning eight of them. Eastern Kentucky and Western Kentucky were also participants in the NCAA Division II playoffs in the early and mid-1970s prior to the NCAA's reclassification of football programs into Division I-AA. The term "I-AA" lasted until the end of the 2006 season when it was changed to Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS).

The first Division I-AA/FCS football playoff was held in 1978 with only four teams, which is the only year through present day that the OVC did not field a playoff representative. In 1979, four of the nation's top teams were invited to the playoffs, and two of them - Eastern Kentucky and Murray State - were from the OVC. Murray dropped its semifinal game to Lehigh, but the Colonels nipped Nevada-Reno in double overtime and claimed the national championship a week later with a 30-7 victory over Lehigh. EKV was coached by former All-America quarterback Roy Kidd, who was in his 16th year at the helm of his alma mater and who skippered the Colonels to a second national title three years later. Following the 2002 season, Kidd retired after 39 years at EKV; upon retirement, he ranked sixth all-time among Division I coaches with 315 victories, earning him a spot in the College Football Hall of Fame. EKV's 20 FCS playoff appearances are the second for the most all-time (behind only Montana).

In addition to Kidd, other coaching legends in the OVC include Charles "Bubber" Murphy, who coached at Middle Tennessee from 1947-1968, Western Kentucky's Jimmy Feix (1968-83), Wilburn Tucker (1954-67) and Don Wade (1968-82) of Tennessee Tech, Bill Ferguson (1967-77) of Murray State, Guy Penny (1959-67) of Morehead State and Boots Donnelly (1977-78 at Austin Peay; 1979-1998 at Middle Tennessee). Following the 2011 season Eastern Illinois head coach Bob Spoo retired following 25 years at the school (the last 16 as members of the OVC). In his time as an OVC coach he compiled 92 total victories (fifth-most in league history) and 68 OVC wins (fourth-most in league history) and was inducted into the OVC Hall of Fame in 2012.

A sampling of former OVC football stars, some of whom were All-Americans during their collegiate careers before achieving stardom at the professional ranks, include Jim Youngblood and Larry Schreiber (Tennessee Tech), Phil Simms (Morehead State), Virgil Livers and Dale Lindsey (Western Kentucky), Myron Guyton and Chad Bratzke (Eastern Kentucky), Cortland Finnegan (Samford) and Tony Romo and Jimmy Garoppolo (Eastern Illinois). In 2008, former Tennessee State standout Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie became just the fourth NFL First Round draft pick in OVC history when he was selected 16th overall by the Arizona Cardinals. He would break into the starting lineup halfway through his rookie season and started at cornerback for the Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII.

The 2007 season marked a return to scholarship football and the OVC for the Austin Peay Governors. Following the 1996 season the Governors dropped scholarship football and competed as both an independent (1997-00, 2006) and as a member of the Pioneer Football League (2001-05).

The 2007 season brought new vernacular to the Ohio Valley Conference and the division formerly known as I-AA. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship

game the term I-AA was changed to NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) in a decision by the Division I Board of Directors. The new label was chosen to communicate in a positive and clear manner the unique differences between Division I football categories (chiefly, the post-season opportunity) while still defining them within the Division I experience. The FCS includes programs that compete in an effort to participate in the NCAA championship postseason structure (one of 89 NCAA national championships) as opposed to the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) which competes in an effort to participate in the postseason bowl system (the 35 NCAA-licensed events which includes the Bowl Championship Series).

In 2010 Southeast Missouri State, picked to finish seventh in the preseason poll, compiled a 7-1 Conference record on the way to its first OVC Championship since joining the league in 1991. Overall the Redhawks were 9-2 during the regular season and earned a berth in the FCS Playoffs, its first playoff berth at any level in the program's 104-year history. Southeast would lose to eventual national champion Eastern Washington in the second round of the playoffs. Head coach Tony Samuel capped the year by winning the Sports Network's Eddie Robinson Award, given to the National Coach of the Year. Samuel was the second OVC coach to win the award (joining Murray State's Houston Nutt who won the award in 1995).

For only the second time in league history in 2011, three teams shared the OVC football championship, as Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State and Tennessee Tech finished with 6-2 records. The only other time in league history more than two champions were crowned at the end of the year was 1962 (when four teams shared the crown).

In 2012 Eastern Illinois became just the fourth football team in OVC history to go from worst-to-first in winning the OVC Championship. The Panthers were led by head coach Dino Babers who became just the fourth first-year head coach to win an OVC Championship (joining Boots Donnelly in 1977, Jason Simpson in 2006 and Dean Hood in 2008). During the year Eastern Illinois junior wide receiver Erik Lora shattered the FCS single-season receptions record, hauling in 136 passes in 12 games; that mark was 13 more than the previous NCAA record and 44 more than the previous OVC mark.

In 2013 Eastern Illinois repeated as OVC Champions behind Walter Payton Award winner Jimmy Garoppolo. The quarterback became just the second OVC player to earn the National Player of the Year Award, joining former EIU signal caller Tony Romo (2002). Garoppolo passed for 5,050 yards (second most in NCAA single-season history) and 53 touchdowns (fourth in NCAA history) in leading the Panthers to a 12-2 record and berth to the quarterfinals of the FCS Playoffs. Garoppolo was drafted by the New England Patriots in the second round of the 2014 NFL Draft, becoming just the fifth OVC player selected in that round and first OVC quarterback selected since 1998.

The 2013 season saw the OVC snap a 19-game playoff losing streak dating back to the 2000 season. Tennessee State shutout Butler (marking the first OVC road playoff victory since 1986) to snap the streak while later that day Jacksonville State smashed Samford in the first round. A week later Eastern Illinois beat Tennessee State while Jacksonville State won at McNeese State to each advance to the quarterfinals; that marked the first time the OVC put two teams in the quarterfinals in the same season since 1991. Overall the four total playoff wins in the same season established a new OVC record.

The vision of leadership demonstrated by the Founding Fathers in 1948 remains alive today as the Ohio Valley Conference prepares for the future. One example is in regard to the current trend in collegiate athletics administration for increased involvement of university presidents in setting policies and making rules. The presidents of OVC institutions, however, have always governed the Conference, long before presidential governance became a national theme.

The Ohio Valley Conference sponsors the following sports: baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis and track for men, and basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, track and volleyball for women. In addition, the OVC also sponsors the combined men's and women's sport of rifle.

Now in its seventh decade of competition, the Ohio Valley Conference has grown significantly from its humble beginnings while increasing the number of athletics opportunities it provides for students. The leagues membership includes charter members Eastern Kentucky University, Morehead State University and Murray State University, along with Austin Peay State University, Eastern Illinois University, Jacksonville State University, Southeast Missouri State University, Southern Illinois University Edwardsville, Tennessee State University, Tennessee Technological University and the University of Tennessee at Martin.

Illinois beat Tennessee State while Jacksonville State won at McNeese State to each advance to the quarterfinals; that marked the first time the OVC put two teams in the quarterfinals in the same season since 1991. Overall the four total playoff wins in the same season established a new OVC record.

The vision of leadership demonstrated by the Founding Fathers in 1948 remains alive today as the Ohio Valley Conference prepares for the future. One example is in regard to the current trend in collegiate athletics administration for increased involvement of university presidents in setting policies and making rules. The I-AA (re-named the Football Championship Subdivision at the end of the 2006 season) Playoffs began in 1978. Eastern Kentucky, which won the I-AA national championship in 1979 and 1982, has been to the playoffs 20 times in the 39-year history of the event. That is the second-most appearances all-time (trailing only Montana).



THE BEGINNING

Football at Eastern Illinois has also been a passion of the EIU student body along with the surrounding community dating back almost as long as the University has been in existence.

While it may not have been a priority when the campus admitted its first student body in the fall of 1899, football quickly became one of the first extra curricular activities on campus. Three weeks into that opening semester, the athletic association was formed, and 45 days after the first doors opened EIU played its initial intercollegiate game.

Oits Campbell, the university's auditor of accounting, was named the first head coach and EIU played its early games on a field located where the current Student Services Building resides. EIU played a team from neighboring Oakland in its first game and later played a game in Effingham against Austin College. EIU lost both contests.

THE FIRST COACH

Until 1911 volunteer faculty coached the team. That year Charles Lantz from Harrisburg, Penn., was hired as the school's first athletic/physical education staff member. Lantz would coach football for 24 seasons during his 42 year stay on the Charleston campus.

During his tenure Lantz was undefeated at home during his first eight seasons which included a 104-0 rout of Pana, the Panthers most lopsided victory. His 1928 team became the last undefeated squad in school history with a 7-0-1 record that earned a share of the Little 19 Conference title.

Also during that time period, internationally known folk singer Burl Ives was a two-way lineman on the team. The Panthers also had their only fatality in an athletic event come in 1915 when Paul Root was injured on a hard tackle against Illinois State. He played one more down, collapsed on the field and later died at the hospital of a broken neck.

THE UNCROSSED GOAL LINE

Lantz's 1930 team may have been one of the best defensive units in school history as they were known as the "uncrossed goal line club." EIU was 6-1-1 that season and did not allow an opponent to score a touchdown the entire season. The only loss was a 2-0 setback to Southern

Illinois as the lone score came when EIU's punter stepped back of the endzone line on a punt. The only other blemish on the record was a 0-0 tie with Bradley.

EIU'S FIRST ALL-AMERICAN

EIU opened the 1940's with another solid season as the Panthers went 6-1-1 under the direction of senior quarterback Bill Glenn. Glenn earned second team Little All-American honors that year as he completed a then school record 65.1 percent of his passes. Glenn would go on to play two years with the Chicago Bears to become the first EIU player associated with a National Football League team.

The 1948 version of EIU football coached by Maynard (Pat) O'Brien appeared to be off to a slow start following a 1-1 showing in the first two games. However, EIU righted the ship to win six of its next seven contests including wins over in-state rivals Northern Illinois, Illinois State and Southern Illinois. Those wins landed EIU in the second annual Corn Bowl played on Thanksgiving Day in Bloomington, Illinois as EIU won the Interstate Intercollegiate Athletic Conference title. EIU would lose their only bowl game appearance to Illinois Wesleyan by a score of 6-0.

LEAN TIMES IN CHARLESTON

Following EIU's 1948 appearance in the Corn Bowl, EIU had only three winning seasons over the next 30 years and only one of them came after 1951. During that 30-year span, EIU witnessed the break-up of the IAC conference as many Illinois schools moved to offering scholarships while EIU did not. Despite not having a winning season on the field, EIU did produce several players who went on to professional careers. Included in that lot was Ray Fisher, who was an original member of the 1960 Dallas Cowboys expansion franchise.

In 1969, EIU moved into a renovated Lincoln Field and offered athletic scholarships for the first time. Though the end of year records remained on the losing side, on the field performances increased as Nate Anderson became the first 1,000 yard running back in EIU history with back-to-back 1,200-plus yard performances in 1972 and 1973. Anderson would earn All-American honors both seasons becoming the first EIU player in more than 32 years to earn that honor.

The early 1970's also produced two long time NFL products as center Ted Petersen was drafted by the Pittsburgh Steelers and played on two Super Championship teams. Jeff Gossett also earned recognition at EIU going on to a 16-year career in the NFL that included one Pro Bowl appearance with the Oakland Raiders.

MUDRA SAVES PANTHER FOOTBALL

Amid grumbling from students and faculty alike, EIU President Gilbert Fite withstood the pressure to disband football and decided one more coach would be given a chance to salvage EIU football.

Athletic director Mike Mullally was able to convince Darrell Mudra to come out of his two-year retirement after being fired at Florida State in 1975. Mudra had performed miracles at other universities and was intrigued to take one more challenge.

Mudra's first order of business was to hire a 25-year-old offensive wizard and EIU alumnus, Mike Shanahan as his offensive coordinator. Bringing in some junior college transfers and convincing the returning players they could win, EIU went from 1-10 in 1977 to 12-2 in 1978 capturing the NCAA Division II National Championship.

The 1978 season started at 4-0 and following back-to-back losses to Youngstown State and Akron, the Panthers would not lose again. EIU won the national championship over Delaware 10-9 as Mudra was tabbed "Dr. Victory" by the *Chicago Tribune* for curing a patient that appeared to be terminal.

Included in the Mudra Years were the rushing of Poke Cobb, the pass catching of James Warring and defense of Pete Catan and Randy Melvin. Mudra

would leave EIU after five seasons with a 47-15-1 record that also included a national runner-up finish in 1980 as they were ranked No. 1 in the nation all season, losing only to Cal Poly in the title game.

I-AA CALLING

Following two National Championship game appearances in three years at the NCAA Division II level, EIU made the jump along with fellow members of the Mid-Continent Conference to the NCAA I-AA level in 1981. The Panthers faltered in their first season but rebounded with a 10-0-1 regular season in 1982 that saw EIU climb to No. 5 in the rankings. The Panthers would advance to the quarterfinals of the NCAA I-AA playoffs that season in the first of 12 NCAA Division I playoff appearances.

INTO THE GATEWAY

Darrell Mudra moved on from EIU in 1982, but his successor, Al Molde was equal to the task. Molde developed an early version of the run-and-shoot and had Sean Payton as the perfect quarterback to run it. Payton would pass for more than 10,000 yards in his career as the Panthers made two NCAA playoff appearances under Molde including a quarterfinal run in 1986, Payton's senior year.

Under Molde the Panthers also became one of the founding members of the Gateway Football Conference (1985) which blended members of the old Mid-Continent Conference and football playing schools in the Missouri Valley Conference. The Panthers also added lights to O'Brien Stadium in 1985 as part of the "Brighten O'Brien" campaign.

Molde also served as head coach in what most believe to be the most exciting game in EIU history. In front of a standing-room-only homecoming crowd of 11,000, Rich Ehmke hit a 58-yard field goal as time expired to lift EIU to a 31-30 win over Northern Iowa.

THE BOB SPOO ERA

While Mudra and Molde combined to win 77 games in nine seasons, no other coach has become more recognized with EIU football than recent head coach Bob Spoo. Spoo took over the coaching reigns following the 1986 season and guided EIU football to 144 wins, ten post-season appearances and numerous All-American selections.

With a philosophy based on a solid run game and sound kicking game, Spoo's program churned out 12 1,000 yard rushers under his watch. The Panthers also churned out several NFL products including former Green Bay Packers defensive lineman John Jurkovic, Buffalo Bills defensive back Chris Watson and current Dallas Cowboys pro bowl quarterback Tony Romo.

Spoo helped guide the Panthers into a new conference as EIU became a member of the Ohio Valley Conference in 1996. Since joining the OVC Panther football has won more than 60 percent of its games with seven post-season appearances as a member of the league.

EIU athletes have also excelled as members of the OVC with Tony Romo winning three-straight Offensive Player of the Year awards (2000-02) that culminated in the winning of the 2002 Walter Payton Award. Other EIU players of the year have been Nick Ricks, Clint Sellers and Donald Thomas as OVC Defenders of the Year while Vincent Webb took home top OVC Offensive honors in 2006.


Following his retirement as EIU head coach, Bob Spoo was inducted into the Ohio Valley Conference Hall of Fame on June 1, 2012.

FAST BREAK FOOTBALL

The Dino Babers era at EIU began December 9, 2011 as the former EIU assistant coach was named the 22nd head coach in the history of the program. Babers led the Panthers to their sixth Ohio Valley Conference title during his first season becoming the fourth EIU coach to take a team to the FCS playoffs. Wide receiver Erik Lora set the FCS single season record with 136 pass receptions. In 2013 EIU posted a 12-2 record climbing to No. 2 in the national rankings as quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo won the Walter Payton Award. Along the way the Panthers offense broke nearly every school and Ohio Valley Conference offensive record scoring 48.2 points per game while averaging 589.5 yards per contest. Seniors Jimmy Garoppolo and Erik Lora both finished their careers ranked in the NCAA top ten on the career passing and receiving lists.

SUCCESS BREEDS CHANGE

The success of Eastern Illinois led to a coaching change as Babers moved on to Bowling Green and the Panthers hired former assistant coach Kim Dameron as the program's 23rd head coach. Dameron was officially hired on January 10, 2014. He was the Panthers defensive coordinator in 2000 as EIU made the NCAA FCS playoffs that season. Dameron led the Panthers to their 16th FCS playoff appearance in 2015.

GAROPPOLO WINS 2013 WALTER PAYTON AWARD

PHILADELPHIA - Heads up, Tony Romo, there is another Eastern Illinois quarterback coming to the NFL.

And Jimmy Garoppolo is bringing his Walter Payton Award with him.

Monday night, Garoppolo became the second Payton Award winner from the Ohio Valley Conference school, following in Romo's footsteps, by outdistancing Eastern Washington quarterback Vernon Adams and Towson running back Terrance West in the voting for FCS outstanding player honors.

The 6-foot-3, 222-pound senior, perhaps the leading offensive candidate from the FCS for the 2014 NFL Draft, gained just over half of the first-place votes - 74 of 147 - and 576 points from a national panel of sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries. Adams was second with 446 points and West third with 370.

Garoppolo was spectacular during the regular season when Eastern Illinois went 11-1, won a second straight outright OVC championship and was ranked No. 2 in the nation, losing only to FBS member Northern Illinois by four points.

He ranked first in the FCS in passing yards (4,489), passing yards per game (374.1) and touchdown passes (48), second in total offense (377.9 yards per game) and points responsible for (25.8 per game), third in passing efficiency (170.6), and fourth in completions per game (26.7).

An easy choice for OVC offensive player of the year, Garoppolo threw for seven touchdowns against Illinois State and six against both Northern Illinois and UT Martin. He even caught a touchdown against Jacksonville State

The native of Arlington Heights, Ill. continued to build on his many Eastern Illinois and OVC records throughout the FCS playoffs this month. He finished the Panthers' 12-2 season completing 375-of-568 pass attempts (66 percent) for 5,050 yards and 53 touchdowns with only nine interceptions.

"Jimmy has had the best season from a college quarterback that I have ever seen, with the exception of maybe Robert Griffin when he won the Heisman at Baylor," said EIU coach Dino Babers, in his second season since arriving from Baylor. "He is the engine that makes us go.

"I'm happy for Jimmy, his family and his teammates for all the success he has had on the field this season and these types of awards are rightly deserved."

Romo, the Dallas Cowboys' star signal caller, won the Payton Award in 2002.

Adams, a 6-foot, 190-pound redshirt sophomore from Pasadena, Calif., finished EWU's 10-2 regular season with 4,059 passing yards and a conference-record 46 touchdown passes. With another 491 yards and four touchdowns on the ground, the Big Sky Conference offensive player of the year led the FCS in total offensive yards per game (379.2) as well as passing efficiency rating (185.7).

Adams has taken Eastern Washington to two FCS playoff wins and into the national semifinals. Overall, he is 291-for-444 for 4,600 yards and 53 touchdowns with 14 interceptions. He's raised his rushing yards to 540.

West, a 5-11, 223-pound junior from Baltimore, led the FCS in rushing yards (1,875) and scoring (31 touchdowns) during Towson's 10-2 regular season. The CAA Football offensive player of the year averaged 6.2 yards on a workhorse 301 carries.

Towson has won two playoff games and West will next square off with Adams in the national semifinals. After rushing for a playoff-record 354 yards against Eastern Illinois in the quarterfinals, West's amazing season totals are 364 carries for 2,295 yards as well as 39 total touchdowns, which ties the FCS single-season record.

The three Payton Award finalists were feted at The Sports Network's FCS Awards Banquet and Presentation along with the winners of the Buck Buchanan Award (Montana State defensive end Brad Daly, FCS outstanding defensive player), Jerry Rice Award (Eastern Washington wide receiver Cooper Kupp, FCS freshman of the year) and Eddie Robinson Award (North Dakota State's Craig Bohl, FCS coach of the year).

Jarrett Payton, son of the late Walter Payton, who enjoyed his Hall of Fame career with the Chicago Bears, presented the 27th Payton Award at the national banquet.

Romo Wins 2002 Walter Payton Award

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn. - Eastern Illinois quarterback Tony Romo was named the 16th winner of the Walter Payton Award at the Division I-AA College Football Awards, on the eve of the 2002 national championship game.

The award is given annually to the most outstanding college football player on the Division I-AA level was established in 1987 by The Sports Network.

The senior passed for 3,165 yards and 34 touchdowns in 2002, completing 258 of 407 passes (63.4 percent) in leading Eastern Illinois to an 8-3 record, the Ohio Valley Conference co-title, and a I-AA playoff berth.

Romo headed one of the most prolific offenses in the nation during the 2002 season, as the Panthers averaged 37.7 points per game despite the presence of two I-A opponents and no sub-I-AA competition on its '02 slate. The Burlington, WI native finished his career with 85 touchdown passes, shattering the previous school mark of 75 held by current New Orleans Saints head coach Sean Payton.



"Walter Payton exemplified what dedication and commitment can accomplish," said Eastern Illinois coach Bob Spoo. "Tony is a classic example of what can be achieved by following Payton's qualities. Tony earned the respect of his teammates by his work ethic. No matter how much individual success he achieved, he still was one of the hardest working players right up to his final collegiate game. That work ethic and leadership resulted in his teammates expecting to succeed. Tony is a quality young man who led his team to victories."

Romo began his 2002 campaign by passing for 319 yards and four touchdowns against I-A Hawaii, and followed that performance by completing 23 of 35 passes against Big 12 power Kansas State. In OVC play, Romo retained his form, completing 28 of 38 for 373 yards and four touchdowns in a win over Tennessee Tech, and came back the next week with 359 yards and two touchdowns against Eastern Kentucky. In the latter game, Romo made perhaps the biggest rush of his career, bolting for an eight-yard touchdown as time expired to give EIU a 25-24 win. The 6-3, 224-pounder wouldn't slow down after that, throwing for a combined 919 yards and 11 touchdowns against league foes Southeast Missouri, Tennessee State and Murray State. For his efforts, Romo was named OVC Offensive Player of the Year, becoming the first player in league history to win three straight such honors.

Romo was the seventh quarterback to win the Payton Award, and the first since Montana's Dave Dickenson in 1995. The senior became the first player from the Ohio Valley Conference to win the Payton, and only the second from the league to capture a major I-AA Award. Murray State's Houston Nutt, now the head coach at Mississippi, won the Eddie Robinson Award in 1995.

Romo received 24 first-place votes and 268 points from the panel of 109 I-AA sports information directors and selected media. Following Romo in the voting were Villanova quarterback Brett Gordon, who earned 18 first-place votes and 245 total points, and Grambling State's Bruce Eugene, who had 21 first-place votes and 234 total points.

The USFL existed as a spring football league started in 1983 in several major markets across the country. It rivaled the NFL in its early ability to sign marquee players to its rosters. The league attempted to go head-to-head with the NFL in 1985 and quickly folded. Pete Catan was an All-League performer in 1984 for the Houston Gamblers.

EASTERN EARNS TITLE OF 'CRADLE OF COACHES' IN THE NATIONAL FOOTBALL LEAGUE

From 2006-2008, Eastern Illinois University held the distinction of being the new 'Cradle of Coaches' in the National Football League with three alumni serving as head coaches in the NFL and four more former players serving as assistant coaches.

In 2006 and 2007, EIU was matched with USC and San Diego State as the only three universities with three current NFL head coaches as alumni. In 2008 that number was trimmed down to just USC and EIU having three head coaches. In 2010 EIU once again was the "NFL Cradle of Coaches" as Mike Shanahan took over as head coach of the Washington Redskins.

Former All-American quarterback Sean Payton, Class of 1987, became the newest member of the distinguished club when he was named head coach of the New Orleans Saints early in 2006. He was an All-American quarterback with Eastern from 1983-86, and threw for a school record 10,655 yards. He still holds 11 single game, season and career passing records. In 2006 he was named the NFL Coach of the Year guiding the Saints to the NFC Championship game. In 2009 he led New Orleans to the Super Bowl Championship defeating the Indianapolis Colts.

Brad Childress, a 1988 graduate, was named head coach of the Minnesota Vikings, following the 2005 season. In 2008 Childress led the Vikings to the NFC North Division championship and in 2009 he led the Vikings to the NFC Championship game where they lost to fellow EIU alumnus Sean Payton and the New Orleans Saints. Childress was released from his contract with the Vikings midway through the 2010 season.

Mike Shanahan, Class of 1974, is the most recognized alumni who has served as a head coach. He led the Denver Broncos to a pair of Super Bowl championships in 1998 and 1999. He was a quarterback with the Panthers in the early 1970s, and then returned as offensive coordinator for the EIU team that won the 1978 NCAA Division II National Championship.

Mike Heimerdinger, Class of 1974, was the offensive coordinator with the Tennessee Titans helping guide the team to a 13-3 record and AFC South Division title in 2008. A former three year letter winner for the Panther baseball team, he still holds the school career stolen base record.

Greg McMahon, Class of 1983, is an assistant special teams coach, with the New Orleans Saints.

John Teerlinck, Class of 1980, was the defensive line coach for the Indianapolis Colts. Teerlinck earned a masters at EIU as an assistant coach for the 1978 NCAA Division II National Championship team.

Eastern Illinois has been an NCAA Division I football program since 1981 but it's relationship with the National Football League dates back to the early 1920's. Lenny High a former EIU Panther football player was a member of the 1920 Decatur Staleys and teammate of George Halas. The Staleys preceded the modern day Chicago Bears with High appearing in one game.

Payton, a former EIU All-American, was hired by New Orleans in 2006. He made an immediate impact in 'post Katrina' New Orleans guiding the Saints to the NFC Championships game in 2006. He was named the NFL Coach of the Year for his efforts that season. In 2009 he led the Saints to a Super Bowl Championship.

Brad Childress





Dallas Cowboys


Ray Fisher played tackle for two seasons for the Pittsburgh Steelers. In 1960 he would become an original member of the Dallas Texans playing defensive tackle.

Leading just 14-10 at the half, the Panthers erupted for three third-quarter big-play touchdowns en route to a 35-31 first-round victory over California-Davis... in that quarter, Mark Campana returned a punt 72 yards for a TD, Scott McGhee caught a 42 yard halfback TD pass from Poke Cobb and Jeff Forster caught a 37 yarder from QB Steve Turk... earlier Turk (15-39-1 for 164 yards) had hit McGhee on a 25 yard TD pass... Cobb ran for 56 yards and caught three for 40 yards in addition to the TD pass... the Panthers' defense intercepted three passes and recovered three fumbles.

Mark Campana's game opening 90-yard-TD kickoff return set the tone as the Panthers knocked off Mid-Continent rival Youngstown State, 26-22, on a rainy and blustery day before an ABC-TV regional audience... trailing 22-14, Steve Turk hit James Warring for a 12 yard TD, pulling to 22-20... then on the first play following the kick-off, Tom Pettigrew recovered a fumble at the YSU 9... three plays later, Poke Cobb scored the winning TD at 4:04 from the 3 yard line... Warring, ABC-TV offensive "Player of the Game" caught 10 passes for 107 yards, while DE Pete Catan, with 10 tackles and two QB sacks, was defensive "Player of the Game"... DT Randy Melvin led with 17 tackles.

EIU 10 • Delaware 9
 December 9, 1978 • Longview, Texas

The Panthers put the capstone on the most incredible season ever, winning the NCAA National Championship 10-9 in front of an ABC-TV national audience... EIU finished 12-2 after going 1-10 the previous year... Poke Cobb, who rushed for 101 yards, scored on a one yard TD run early in the fourth quarter to put the Panthers ahead but victory was not assured until Delaware's Brandt Kennedy missed a 45 FG with nine seconds... EIU's defense limited Delaware's vaunted Wing-T offense to just 155 yards rushing and forced five fumbles... LB Ray Jeske was in on 21 tackles... altogether the Panthers set 25 school records with Cobb, James Warring, and Pete Catan named All-Americans.

Cal Poly's Robbie Martin was a one-man wrecking crew... he returned eight punts for 97 yards including a 42 yarder for a TD, and then caught seven passes for 164 yards including TDs of 33 and 58 yards... the Panthers lost three scoring opportunities when they fumbled twice within the five yard line and were intercepted on the 15... Rod Slaughter caught six passes for 122 yards and ran for 75.

A Cinderella Story... words that could easily describe the Eastern Illinois football program's rise from mediocrity to the top of the NCAA Division II football world.

The Panthers entered the 1978 season much like any other season mired in a 16-year string of consecutive losing seasons with only two winning seasons since 1951.

The first step in changing Panther football was the hiring of head coach Darrell Mudra who immediately hired former Eastern Illinois student and football team member Mike Shanahan as his offensive coordinator.

EIU opened the season on a roll with convincing wins over Central State, 42-16 and Butler, 42-3. A strong 38-22 win over Northern Iowa in a conference football game gave the program some confidence that things were headed in the right direction.

A 4-0 start followed the next week with a 29-12 win over Northeast Missouri giving the Panthers their second 4-0 start in three seasons. The 1976 squad also opened the year 4-0 but would win only one game the remainder of the year to finish at 5-6.

Shades of that season resonated in Panther fans minds as EIU dropped back-to-back games in weeks five and six to Akron and Youngstown State. However unlike their 1976 counterparts, this Panther squad would regroup and not taste defeat again.

Mike Shanahan's offensive unit continued to click as the Panthers put up 40 or more points in three of their next five victories with wins over Northern Michigan, Wayne State, Illinois State, Murray State and Western Illinois.

The following week EIU received only its second post-season bid as the Panthers were invited to the NCAA Division II playoffs as only the top eight teams received invitations. The Panthers only other post-season experience had been way back in 1948 when they lost in the Corn Bowl to Illinois Wesleyan, 6-0.


EIU hit the road to open the championship run with a 35-31 victory at UC Davis. The Panthers then returned home to face Youngstown State in the semifinals, a team that had defeated EIU earlier in the season 40-24 in Youngstown.

This time EIU had the home field advantage and the Panthers were able to hang on for a 26-22 win in front of a national audience as the game was carried nationwide on ABC. Following the game EIU fans stormed the field and dismantled the goal posts.

That win set up a meeting with Division II power Delaware and after a tightly fought contest the game came down to a field goal by Delaware's Brandt Kennedy that sailed right from 45-yards. With that, "David had beaten Goliath" and Eastern Illinois had done the impossible with a 10-9 national championship victory in Longview, Texas.

Following the season EIU players earned All-American honors including running back Poke Cobb, wide receiver James Warring and defensive lineman Pete Catan. Catan, Cobb, Warring and quarterback Steve Turk all ranked among the national leaders in several statistical categories.

Darrell Mudra was later inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame.

In their first year in NCAA I-AA, the Panthers took a 10-0-1 record and No. 5 ranking into the playoffs and relied on Dave Strauch's 23 yard field goal in overtime to knock off No. 8 Jackson State, 16-13. Strauch redeemed himself after a missed 22 yard attempt with four seconds left in regulation...QB Jeff Christensen completed 26-50, a NCAA I-AA tournament record for passes attempted, for 308 yards and one TD...Jerry Wright caught 10 for 130 yards.

Tennessee State 20 • EIU Panthers 19
December 4, 1982 • Nashville, Tennessee

In another evenly matched playoff, the Panthers suffered a heartbreaking 20-19 loss to No. 4 ranked Tennessee State...QB Jeff Christensen (27-48-3 for 264 yards) had pulled the Panthers to within one with a six yard TD toss to Jerry Wright midway through the final quarter...but he was intercepted in the closing minutes on the TSU-20, and then the Panthers' Dave Strauch had a 44 yard field goal blocked with just seconds left...Kevin Staple ran for 112 yards, and Wright caught 19 for 136 yards... this game was later forfeited by TSU due to an ineligible player.



The 1982 Panthers run defense (shown here against Akron) set an NCAA record in EIU's final regular season win over Kentucky State. In that game, EIU held the Thorobreds offense to negative 12 yards of total offense during a 73-0 romp. That defensive unit registered 71 total sacks while ranking second in the NCAA in scoring defense at 8.8 points per game. The Panthers would climb to No. 5 in the final regular-season poll with six total All-Americans on that squad.

November 25, 1948 (Thanksgiving Day)

Illinois Wesleyan - 6
Eastern Illinois - 0

Eastern Illinois (the champion of the Illinois Intercollegiate Athletic Conference) and Illinois Wesleyan (the champion of the College Conference of Illinois) met on the gridiron on Thanksgiving Day, 1948 in the second annual Corn Bowl played in Bloomington, Illinois. The 8,000 fans attending that day's game marked the largest crowd in the existence of the short-lived bowl sponsored by the Hybird Seed Corn Breeders Company.



Bob Lush scored the game's lone touchdown plunging over from 1-yard out with 1:20 left to play in the fourth quarter to give Illinois Wesleyan the 6-0 win.

EIU would drive the ball inside the IWU 35 yard line on four occasions during the game including reaching the 2-yard line where the Panthers were turned away. IWU's other scoring chance included a missed 24-yard field goal.

EIU passed for only 63 yards on the day and the ground game which had carried the Panthers to the IIAC regular season title was shut down.

EIU's starting 11 in the contest were - Gross and Cox (ends), Carlyle and Pitol (tackles), Sexson (center), Tschannen and Baker (guards), Sweet (fullback), Lopinski (quarterback), Johnson and Benoche (halfbacks).

Mark Campana returned a punt 72-yards for a touchdown to open the third quarter and Eastern Illinois tacked on two more touchdowns as the Panthers knocked off UC Davis 35-31 in the NCAA Division II playoff opening round. Leading 14-10 at the half, EIU increased the lead to 21-10 on Campana's long punt return. EIU then recovered a fumble on the next UCD drive and scored on a halfback pass from Poke Cobb to Scott McGhee covering 42 yards. EIU's final score in the quarter was on a Steve Turk screen pass to Jeff Forster. UC Davis scored three touchdowns in the fourth quarter including one in the final five seconds to close the game. It marked EIU's first post-season win and only second post-season appearance in school history following a loss in the 1948 Corn Bowl.

Eastern Illinois rallied to score two touchdowns in the fourth quarter as the Panthers knocked off Youngstown State, 26-22, in the NCAA Division II semifinals. Earlier in the season YSU had beaten EIU 40-24 in Youngstown. EIU opened the game with Mark Campana returning the opening kick 90 yards for a score. Lonnie Denton gave the Panthers a 14-6 lead with a 5-yard run at the end of the first quarter. Heading into the fourth quarter EIU trailed 22-14. After EIU made a stop on the first SIU drive, the Panthers fumbled their first offensive snap inside the redzone allowing SIU to score a couple of plays later. SIU held Ademola Adeniji to just 76 yards rushing as the Panthers scored 11 points late but were never really in the contest. Nick Hill was a dual threat passing for 234 yards while rushing for 32 yards and a touchdown. EIU did play with out All-American wide receiver Micah Rucker for a majority of the game. Senior linebacker Donald Thomas finished his career with a 15 tackle game.

In the long history of Eastern Illinois football many players have distinguished themselves on the playing field. In 2009 EIU retired its first football number with the No. 17 formally worn by Tony Romo being retired at homecoming against Tennessee Tech. In 2010 Sean Payton's No. 18 was retired during the season opening contest against Central Arkansas.

O'Brien Field, home for Panther football, is a 10,000 seat stadium with Pro-Grass artificial turf that was installed in 2004.

The stadium was named after the late **Maynard 'Pat' O'Brien**, former football, track and cross country coach and one of ten charter members of EIU's 'Hall of Fame'.

Originally constructed in 1970, a \$2 million 'Reach for the 21st Century' renovation was completed in 1999 with new offices added for coaches, meeting and video rooms, locker room, expanded weight room and athletic training facilities.

Since the stadium first opened in 1970, six NCAA football post-season tournament playoff games have been held here. The Illinois High School Association annually hosts its boys and girls state track and field meets here, which features nearly 5,000 competitors and over 15,000 spectators. A regional Special Olympics is also held in the stadium each spring.

The stadium served as the summer home for the former St. Louis Cardinals football team in 1976 & 1977 and again from 1982-87. The 'Brighten O'Brien' capital project added lights and another level onto the press box in 1986.

In the summer of 2008 the team locker room was renovated in the summer of 2009 a state of the art video/audio scoreboard was installed in the north end zone.


