EIU Faces Defending OVC Champion Jacksonville State

NOTES TO KNOW

- Johnathan Brantley came off the bench against Murray State going 28-of-42 for 328 yards and three touchdowns. In the fourth quarter Brantley broke the school record for consecutive passes without an interception previously held by Jalen Whitlow (163 in 2014). Brantley ended the game with his streak at 174.
- Alexander Hollins hauled in two touchdowns on Saturday against Murray State as he now has 11 touchdowns on the season to lead the FCS. It was the fourth game this season that Hollins has had multiple touchdown catches. He has two games (at Arkansas and Indiana State) with three touchdown receptions.
- For the second time this season a pair of Eastern Illinois wide receivers both finished with more than 100 yards receiving in a game. Alexander Hollins had ten catches for 132 yards while Aaron Gooch hauled in eight passes for 124 yards. They combined for 277 yards and 20 catches earlier this year against Indiana State.
- Eastern Illinois offense scored 40 or more points for the fourth straight game putting 41 on the board against Murray State. It marked only the second time in school history that EIU has scored 40 or more points in four straight games. The other time was Oct. 19 through Nov. 16 during the 2002 season with quarterback Tony Romo.
- Eastern Illinois had 643 yards of total offense on Saturday against Murray State with that total ranking as the ninth best day in school history. The last time EIU had more than 600 yards of total offense was Sept. 24, 2016 with 641 yards against Austin Peay.

THE SERIES

- Eastern Illinois and Jacksonville State will be meeting for the 16th time on Saturday with the Gamecocks having won four straight in the series to take a 9-6 all-time series lead. JSU's last loss in the series in November of 2013 was also the last time they lost an Ohio Valley Conference game as the team currently has the second longest all-time conference win streak in FCS at 35 (39 by Duquesne). EIU's last win at Jacksonville State was Oct. 24, 2009 when EIU beat JSU 28-20.

• Alexander Hollins finished with ten catches against Murray State marking the second time this season he has hauled in double figure catches (10 against Indiana State). Hollins now has 100 receptions at Eastern Illinois as he currently ranks second in the NCAA this season with 53 receptoins. He needs 12 more catches to break into the EIU single season top ten.

• Alexander Hollins did land himself in one of the Panthers single season top ten lists as his two touchdown catches gave him 11 which leads the FCS this season. His 11 touchdowns are currently tied for ninth on the EIU single season list. He needs two more catches to crack the OVC single season top ten. The school and OVC record for touchdown catches in a season is 19 by Erik Lora in 2013.

• Alexander Hollins added his fifth 100-yard receiving game of the season with 132 yards against Murray State. It was the ninth 100-yard receiving game of his career as he ranks sixth on that EIU career list. Hollins needs one more 100-yard receiving game to tie Calvin Pierce for fifth on the EIU charts.

• Alexander Hollins 132 yards against Murray State gave him 733 yards on the season as he ranks third in the FCS in receiving yards. Hollins is on pace to become the 13th player in school history with 900 yards receiving in a season and ninth player with more than 1,000. He is currently 16th on EIU's career receiving yards list with 1,427.

• Aaron Gooch was equally as effective at the inside slot receiver on Saturday against Murray State as the senior had his second 100-yard receiving game of his career with 124 yards. Gooch is currently 36th in the FCS in receiving yards this season with 466 yards.

• Aaron Gooch joined Alexander Hollins in the 1,000 yard receiving club at Eastern Illinois against Murray State as Gooch became the 32nd player in school history with 1,000 yards. He now has 1,080 yards to rank 28th all-time with the Panthers.

• Aaron Gooch hauled in eight passes against Murray State as he ranks second on the team and 30th in the FCS this season with 35 catches. Gooch passed the century mark for career catches on Saturday against the Racers as he now has 104 catches. The last time EIU had two players with 100 or more career receptions on the same team was 2013 with Erik Lora and Adam Drake both over 100.

• Jamal Scott rushed for 115 yards against Murray State giving the Panthers back-to-back games with 100-yard running backs. It was the best rushing effort of the season for the transfer running back who spent last year at Independence CC in Kansas and was one of the featured athletes on the Netflix Series Last Chance U. Scott leads the Panthers with 392 yards rushing to rank fourth in the OVC.

• Running back Isaiah Johnson missed the Murray State game with an injury. In his last game Johnson rushed for 161 yards in the win at Tennessee Tech. It was the third 100-yard rushing game of Johnson's career. He currently has 954 rushing yards as he tries to become the 29th player in school history to pass the 1,000 yard rushing mark for their career.

• Josh Delgado had eight kickoffs on Saturday against Murray State sending five of the eight for touchbacks and a 63.4 yards per kick average. On the season the freshman has 38 total kickoffs with ten going for touchbacks and a kickoff average of 60.9 yards per kick.

• Matt Reyna had four kickoff returns for 106 yards to average 26.5 yards per return with a long of 38 yards. For the season Reyna is ninth in the FCS in total kickoff return yards and ranks 33rd in the FCS with a 23.9 yards per return average. This season Reyna has one kickoff return for a touchdown going 96 yards against Indiana State.

• Nolan Dean was the Panthers leading tackler on Saturday against Murray State finishing with 12 tackles. A converted running back, Dean made his second straight start at linebacker as he now has 26 tackles on the season, 18 of those coming in the last two games.

• Joe Caputo finished with 11 tackles including one tackle for loss against Murray State. It was the second time this season Caputo has finished with double figure tackles after a season high 13 against Illinois State. Caputo currently leads EIU with 47 tackles which ranks ninth in the OVC this season.

• The Eastern Illinois defense was limited to just four tackles for loss and no sacks against Murray State. One of the tackles for loss was by senior Levi Watson who ranks first on the team in both tackles for loss (7.5) and sacks (3) this season. Watson is currently third in the OVC in tackles for loss this year.

• Murray State racked up 658 yards of total offense and 449 yards on the ground during Saturday's game at Eastern Illinois. It was the third highest number of total yards gained against an EIU defense in school history and the fourth highest number of rushing yards against the Panthers.

• Senior Josh Price recovered a fumble for the Panthers as EIU had two turnovers gained in the contest. It was the third fumble recovery of his career as Price added three tackles in the game.

• Edwyn Brown picked off a pass against Murray State as the Panthers had two turnovers gained against the Racers. It was the first interception of Brown's career and the third of the season by the Panthers defense.

• EIU had two turnovers gained against Murray State as the Panthers have now posted three straight games with multiple turnovers gained after not forcing a turnover in the first three contests of the year. It marked the 28th time under head coach Kim Dameron that the Panthers have forced two or more turnovers in a game.

• Nick Bruno was 2-of-3 on field goal attempts against Murray State knocking home kicks from 22 and 30 yards out. For the season Bruno is now 36-of-52 on field goals with a career long of 48 yards coming earlier this year against Tennessee State. His 36 field goals made rank second on the EIU career list.

• Nick Bruno was 5-for-5 on extra point attempts against Murray State as he is now 21-of-22 for the season. For his career Bruno is 135-of-138 on extra points as he ranks second on the EIU career list. Bruno now has 243 career points as he ranks sixth all-time on the EIU scoring list. He needs 15 points to tie former running back Vincent Webb for fifth on the list.

• A week after tying the school record for first downs in a game with 38, the Panthers offense continued to pick up first downs against Murray State. EIU finished with 35 first downs which is tied for the fifth highest total in a game in school history. EIU is currently second in the FCS in first downs offense with 157 ranked only behind Samford with 164.

• Eastern Illinois converted on 8-of-17 3rd downs on Saturday against Murray State as the Panthers rank 16th in the FCS and second in the OVC in 3rd down conversion percentage at 46.5 percent. EIU will face the nation's best 3rd down defense this weekend as Jacksonville State is holding opponents to only 23.1 percent on 3rd down.

• Eastern Illinois faces No. 7/8 Jacksonville State this Saturday. The Panthers are 25-63 all-time against ranked FCS opponents including a 8-33 record against Top 10 opponents. EIU's last win over a top ten ranked FCS team was Sept. 17, 2016 when EIU beat No. 5 Illinois State, 24-21 at O'Brien Field. EIU's last road win over a Top 10 FCS team was Nov. 25, 1989 with a 38-21 win at No. 4 Idaho in the FCS playoffs.

EIU HEAD COACH KIM DAMERON

Kim Dameron is in his fifth season as the Eastern Illinois head football coach. Dameron led the Panthers to the FCS playoffs in 2015 as EIU was ranked 23rd in the final FCS Coaches poll. Dameron was the defensive coordinator at Louisiana Tech prior to taking the EIU head job and has more than 15 years of experience as a defensive coordinator with more than 30 years of experience as a college coach. Dameron served as the EIU defensive coordinator in 2000 helping the program rebound from a 2-10 season in 1999 to an 8-4 record and FCS playoff appearance in 2000. Dameron played football at Arkansas appearing in four bowl games between 1979-82. He is a 1983 graduate of Arkansas. Complete Coach Kim Dameron bio available on page 6 of EIU game notes...

JACKSONVILLE STATE HEAD COACH JOHN GRASS

John Grass has had one of the most successful stints to open a coaching career in FCS history. Now in his fifth season Grass has led Jacksonville State back to a top ten national ranking after losing in the FCS National Championship game in 2015. The 1990 Jacksonville State graduate has yet to lose an OVC game going 34-0 so far in his career with a 47-9 overall coaching record. He was JSU's offensive coordinator in 2013 before taking over as the head coach. He was a successful high school coach in Alabama with heading coaching stints at five different schools.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE

Jacksonville State is nationally ranked in the top ten as they host Eastern Illinois this weekend. The Gamecocks have won an OVC record 34 straight league contests, the last lost coming in 2013 to Eastern Illinois and quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo. In a league that is putting up big offensive numbers, JSU is right there ranking third in the FCS in scoring offense and fourth in total offense. Quarterback Zerrick Cooper has passed for 1,136 yards and 11 touchdowns this season. The Gamecocks defense is the best in the nation this season allowing just 221 yards per game. Jalen Choice is the team leader with 30 tackles while Connor Christian has four sacks.

ON THIS DATE IN EIU HISTORY

Oct. 13, 1990 - Tim Lance earned his second National Defensive Player of the Week honor helping Eastern Illinois pick up a 31-22 win over Indiana State. Lance had 12 tackles, an interception and four pass-breaks up in the game but his biggest play was blocking a punt which resulted in the go-ahead touchdown. Jamie Jones rushed for 132 yards and back-up quarterback Lee Borkowski was 11-of-15 for 175 yards and a touchdown in place of starter Jeff Thorne.

ON OFFENSIVE LEAGUE

Eastern Illinois and Murray State combined for 1,301 yards of total offense on Saturday night which was right in line with the totals put up across the Ohio Valley Conference. As a league the OVC had 4,185 total yards of offense and 343 points scored.

SHUT OUT STREAK ENDS

Eastern Illinois had a 139 game streak of not being shut out in a game end Sept. 12, 2015 at Northwestern during 41-0 loss. The last time EIU had been shut out was Oct. 11, 2003 during a 41-0 loss versus Eastern Kentucky. In the 2015 season opener EIU had its streak of consecutive games scoring a touchdown end at 65 after the Panthers were held out of the end zone. The last time EIU had failed to score a touchdown was October 10, 2009 at Penn State. EIU's longest streak of consecutive games without being shutout was 197 from 1977-1997 which ranks fourth all-time among FCS schools.

OVC SUCCESS

Eastern Illinois was the OVC's most successful school in terms of wins during the first decade of the 2000's as the Panthers posted 72 wins during that span. EIU leads the conference with the most post-season appearances since the Panthers joined the league in 1996.

KIM DAMERON
(Arkansas, 1983) -- 5th Season (Career Record 24-23, 21-11 OVC)

Kim Dameron was hired as the 24th head coach in program history and the fifth in the NCAA Division I era in January of 2014.

The 2017 season may have been one of the most pulse stopping in recent years as the Panthers posted their third straight winning season under Dameron with all six victories coming by three points or less with a total margin of victory of 15 points for the year. Three of the wins were in overtime with two of them coming in double overtime. The wins on the season came in a variety of ways with two last play touchdown wins, two defensive stands, one game winning field goal and one game winning field goal block. EIU placed seven players on the All-OVC team and had defensive back Mark Williams earn Freshman All-American honors.

In 2016 the Panthers quickly climbed into the FCS playoff picture as they knocked off FBS member Miami (Ohio) and beat No. 5 ranked Illinois State in the Mid-America Classic. Dameron would guide EIU to a No. 13 ranking in the polls at the midway portion of the season. The Panthers would face several key injuries late in the season and finished the year at 6-5 overall following a 24-0 win at Eastern Kentucky to end the season. EIU was 4-4 in the OVC. The Panthers had four players earn All-OVC honors with Devin Church and Seth McDonald both earning first team honors.

Dameron returned the Panthers to the FCS playoffs in 2015 as EIU won seven of their last eight regular season games to finish with a 7-4 regular season record. EIU lost in the opening round of the FCS playoffs at Northern Iowa. The Panthers were ranked No. 23 in the final FCS Coaches poll after making their 16th all-time FCS playoff appearance. During the season Dameron's team produced six All-OVC players including co-Defensive Player of the Year Dino Fanti. Dameron would have his first player from Eastern Illinois drafted in May of 2016 when linebacker Kamu Grugier-Hill became a sixth round selection of the New England Patriots.

In his first season Dameron coached the Panthers to a 5-7 record including 5-3 in the Ohio Valley Conference as the Panthers were in the championship race until the final weeks of the season. Dameron's first career victory came on Sept. 20 against Austin Peay as the Panthers won 63-7. In the game EIU tied a school record for rushing yards with 413. The team featured three All-American selections including first team offensive lineman Collin Seibert and freshman All-American kicker Nick Bruno. Dameron's squad had five first team All-OVC selections and five second team All-OVC honorees. The team was among the best on both sides of the ball in the OVC ranking second in total offense (11th nationally) and third in total defense.

Dameron spent the 2013 season as the defensive coordinator at Louisiana Tech where he directed a much improved defensive unit. The Bulldogs finished ranked 69th in the nation in total defense under Dameron's direction after being ranked 120th the previous season. Dameron's defense was the fourth most-improved squad in the FBS last season.

An experienced defensive coach with more than 15 years as a defensive coordinator Dameron took over an Eastern Illinois program that advanced to the FCS playoff quarterfinals last season. It is Dameron's second stint in Charleston as he previously worked as the defensive coordinator at EIU in 2000 as a member of head coach Bob Spoo's staff. During that 2000 season, Dameron helped transform the Panthers defense as they rebounded from a 2-10 season in 1999 to 8-4 and Ohio Valley Conference Champions in 2000.

Dameron spent three seasons as the safeties coach at Ole Miss as the team appeared in two Cotton Bowls. Two of his players were selected in the NFL draft as his pass defense unit ranked 11th in the NCAA in pass efficiency defense and 15th in pass defense.

Prior to his stint at Ole Miss, Dameron was the defensive coordinator at Louisiana-Monroe as the program became bowl eligible at the FBS level for the first time in 2007 while also picking up a win over Alabama. The ULM defense led the Sun Belt Conference in fewest points allowed and ranking third nationally in turnovers gained.

Dameron has previous stops as the defensive coordinator at Stephen F. Austin and as the secondary coach at Cincinnati and UNLV. He spent the 1999 season as the secondary coach in the Canadian Football League with the Toronto Argonauts.

He has previous FCS coaching experience on the staffs of Murray State and Missouri State where he helped coach both teams to FCS playoff appearances.

Dameron began his coaching career as a graduate assistant
