DR. DAVID GLASSMAN EASTERN ILLINOIS UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT



David M. Glassman is the 12th president of Eastern Illinois University taking over the position in June of 2014. He came to EIU after serving as provost and vice president for academic affairs at Bradley University, a private university located in Peoria, Ill.

Glassman has experience with both private and public institutions of higher education, having spent 19 years (1985-2004) as a faculty member, associate dean and chair of the Anthropology Department at Texas State University (formerly Southwest Texas), in San Marcos. His tenure as a professor of anthropology and Dean of the College of Liberal Arts at the University of Southern Indiana, Evansville, followed (2004-2010), and he arrived at Bradley University as provost and vice president for academic affairs later in 2010.

He earned both a master's degree and doctorate in anthropology from the University of Tennessee, Knoxville, after completing his undergraduate studies at the University of Minnesota.

TOM MICHAEL EASTERN ILLINOIS ATHLETIC DIRECTOR



Tom Michael was formally introduced as the 10th full-time athletic director in Eastern Illinois University history on July 22, 2014 and began his role on August 11.

He came to EIU after serving as the Senior Associate Athletic Director at the University of Illinois since 2012. One of his final projects was overseeing the renovations to the State Farm Center.

Michael joined the Illinois athletic department in 1996 as an academic counselor. He worked for 12 years in administration serving as both an associate athletic director and assistant athletic director for student services. In addition to his role in the State Farm Center renovation Michael oversaw Academic Services, Equipment, Event Management, Sports Medicine and Strength and Conditioning for the athletic department.

Michael received both his bachelor's degree (1993) and master's degree (1994) from Illinois. He played four years for the Fighting Illini basketball program from 1991-94 helping the team make two trips to the NCAA Tournament. He was a two-time Academic All-Big Ten Selection and holds the Illinois single season record for 3-point field goal percentage.

Following his playing days Michael worked in his family's business prior to joining the staff at Illinois in 1996. He and his wife Shana have three children (Nicholas, Nathaniel and Kylie).

2015 COLLEGEINSIDER.COM TOURNAMENT



Eastern Illinois men's basketball made its third postseason appearance playing in the 2015 CollegeInsiders.com Tournament (CIT). It was the first postseason appearance for the Panthers since the 2001 NCAA Tournament.

EIU beat Oakland in the opening round, 97-91, to win their first postseason game as an NCAA Division I school.

EIU lost to eventual CIT champion Evansville in the second round playing at Lantz Arena. The Purple Aces won 83-68.

EIU finished the season at 18-15 overall, the second winning season for EIU since the 2001 campaign. The 18 wins ranks as the fifth most in a season at the Division I level.

JAY SPOONHOUR

5th season

(Pittsburg State, 1994)

14th Men's Basketball Head Coach (hired April 9, 2012)

When he was about 16 years old Jay Spoonhour remembers sitting at the end of the bench at Southwest Missouri State (now Missouri State) where his dad Charlie was the head coach and watching the Bears play Eastern Illinois and All-American Jay Taylor.

Fast forward some 20-plus years and Jay Spoonhour has almost come full circle as he was named the head coach of the Eastern Illinois University men's basketball program in April of 2012. Spoonhour is the 14th head coach in the program's history and only the third head coach since the program joined the NCAA Division I ranks in 1981.

Spoonhour made an immediate impact on the Panthers basketball fortunes in his first season on the bench. Playing with just ten active players on the roster, Spoonhour's team became a cohesive unit midway through the Ohio Valley Conference season. After opening conference play with a 0-6 mark, EIU closed the season winning six of ten games including a 61-46 win over SIU Edwardsville on the final day of the season. That win locked up the No. 7 seed in the OVC Tournament and marked the Panthers first return to the league's post season tournament since 2010.

In 2014, the Panthers would again advance to the OVC Tournament after finishing the regular season in third place of the OVC West Division - just the second time EIU has made back-to-back tournament appearances since the 2003 season. Sherman Blanford and Reggie Smith both earned All-OVC honors as Blanford was tabbed to the second team while Smith was named to the newcomer team, respectively. It marked the first time since 2010 that the Panthers had multiple players named to the All-OVC Teams.

In 2015 Spoonhour coached the Panthers to an 18-15 record which was only EIU's second winning season since the 2001 season. The 18 wins were the fifth most in the school's NCAA Division I history and included an NCAA Division I school record nine straight wins in December and January. During the season EIU appeared in the Mid-Major Top 25 poll for the first time since the 2001 season. EIU advanced to the quarterfinals of the OVC Tournament before appearing in the CollegeInsiders.com Postseason Tournament. EIU beat Oakland in the opening round for the program's first NCAA Division I postseason victory. The Panthers had two players - Trae Anderson and Cornell Johnston - both earn All-OVC honors with Johnston being named the OVC Freshman of the Year.

In 2015-16 EIU once again returned to the Ohio Valley Conference Tournament as Anderson earned first team All-OVC honors. The Panthers finished 9-7 in the OVC marking the first time since the 1999-2000, 2000-01 seasons that EIU had posted back-to-back winning seasons in the OVC.

Last season (2016-17) EIU posted one its biggest wins in school history as the Panthers went on the road to beat Southeastern Conference member Missouri. The Panthers featured a balanced scoring attack which helped EIU go 8-5 in the non-conference portion of its schedule. Playing in a very balanced OVC, the Panthers failed to make the OVC Tournament for the first time under Spoonhour finishing with a 14-15 overall record, 6-10 in the league.

Spoonhour grew up in a basketball family with his dad Charlie a long time head coach at Missouri State, Saint Louis and UNLV. Spoonhour played college basketball at Pittsburg State in Kansas earning his bachelor's degree in 1994. He was an honorable mention All-Conference selection. He then began his coaching career as a graduate assistant coach at Central Missouri helping the team advance to two straight NCAA Division II Tournaments.

He joined his father's staff at Saint Louis in 1996 and helped the Billikens make the 1998 NCAA Tournament advancing to the second round. He was hired as the head coach at Wabash Valley College in Mt. Carmel, Ill., for the 2000-01 season leading the team to the Junior College National Championship with a 36-1 record. He was named the NJCAA National Coach of the Year that season.

Winning is something that Spoonhour has been able to do at all levels of basketball. During his third season as the head coach at Moberly Area Community College in Missouri he guided the team to its second NJCAA Region 16 Tournament appearance in three seasons. In four total years as a head coach at the junior college level he has amassed a career record of 100-29. In 2004 Spoonhour was the interim head coach at UNLV guiding the Runnin' Rebels to a 6-3 record as they lost in the championship game of the Mountain West Conference Tournament.

After one season at Wabash Valley College, Spoonhour joined his father's staff at UNLV from 2001-04. His father Charlie stepped down in the final month of the season giving Jay a taste of the head coaching experience at the Division I level.

Following the 2004 season Spoonhour worked two seasons each at Missouri and Texas San Antonio before taking over as the head coach and athletic director at Moberly Area CC.

Spoonhour and his wife Nicole have three children Gracie, Charlie and Sam.



RAND CHAPPELL

Assistant Coach | 5th Season at EIU | Missouri State, 1985

Rand Chappell was named an assistant coach on the Panther men's basketball staff under head coach Jay Spoonhour prior to the start of the 2013-14 season.

Chappell helped the Panthers advance to the 2014 OVC Tournament, just the second time EIU has made back-to-back tournament appearances since the 2003 season. He also helped coach Sherman Blanford and Reggie Smith to All-OVC honors, the first time since 2010 that the Panthers have had multiple players named to the All-OVC Teams.

In his second season on Spoonhour's staff, Chappell helped the Panthers post only EIU's second winning season since the 2001 season. EIU finished with an 18-15 record including winning an NCAA Division I school record nine straight games in December and January. EIU appeared in the CollegelInsiders.com Postseason Tournament beating Oakland in the opening round for the program's first NCAA Division I postseason victory. He helped coach Trae Anderson and Cornell Johnston to All-OVC honors, with Johnston named the OVC Freshman of the Year.

In 2015-16 EIU once again returned to the Ohio Valley Conference Tournament as Anderson earned first team All-OVC honors. The Panthers finished 9-7 in the OVC marking the first time since the 1999-2000, 2000-01 seasons that EIU had posted back-to-back winning seasons in the OVC. Last season (2016-17), he helped the Panthers post an 8-5 record in the non-conference portion of the schedule including a win at Southeastern Conference member Missouri.

Chappell has ties to the Spoonhour family going back to his playing days at Southwest Missouri State (now Missouri State) where he played for Charlie Spoonhour and was later an assistant coach for the Bears.

Chappell came to EIU following a one-year stint as the head coach at Garden City Community College, a member of the Kansas Jayhawk Conference. Prior to that Chappell was the head coach at Central Arkansas guiding the program from the NCAA Division II ranks to its current NCAA Division I status. Chappell posted 104 wins with the program between 2003-10 including taking UCA to its first NCAA Division II Tournament appearance in 2005.

Chappell was the head coach at Henderson State for five seasons leading the team to four Gulf South Conference Tournament Championships and five straight NCAA Division II Tournament appearances. He was the head coach at Phillips University (NAIA) from 1996-98. At Phillips he won 78 games in three years leading the school to two NAIA National Tournament appearances while being ranked number one in the nation during 1998 season. Chappell's first head coaching stop was at Labette Community College where he won 45 games in two seasons reaching the NJCAA Region VI Tournament both seasons.

Chappell holds both his undergraduate and graduate degrees from Missouri State. During his coaching career as both a head coach and assistant coach, Chappell has been to ten NCAA Tournaments and two NAIA National Tournaments.



ROB HOLLOWAY

Assistant Coach | 2nd Season at EIU | Eastern Illinois, 2005

Rob Holloway joins head coach Jay Spoonhour's men's basketball coaching staff after working the 2015-16 season as an assistant coach for Bob Sundvold at the University of Missouri-St. Louis.

In his first season on the EIU staff he helped the Panthers post an 8-5 record in the non-conference portion of the schedule including a win at Southeastern Conference member Missouri.

Prior to his one season at UMSL, Holloway spent three years as the head coach at Kennedy-King College in Chicago. During his tenure the team posted a 48-46 record and had six All-Region performers including 2015 NJCAA All-Region 4 selection Dewan White. White also earned the NJCAA Superior Academic Achievement Award in 2015 after recording a GPA between 3.8 and 3.99.

Holloway was also on the coaching staff for a pair of NJCAA Region 4 runner-up squads in 2009 and 2012 at Kennedy-King College.

He is a graduate of Eastern Illinois University and worked in private business for several years before embarking on a career as a basketball coach.



TONE BOYLE

Assistant Coach | 1st Season at EIU | Milwaukee, 2012

Tone Boyle begins his first season as an assistant coach on Jay Spoonhour's Eastern Illinois men's basketball staff.

Boyle comes to EIU following three years as the head coach at Highland Community College in Illinois. In 2016-17 he coached HCC to the Arrowhead Conference Championship and NCAA Region IV Championship as the team posted a 27-7 record advancing to the NJCAA National Tournament in Hutchinson, Kansas. He coached second team JUCO All-American D'Angelo Jackson, a recent EIU recruit. Boyle won 62 games in three seasons HCC as he won 21 games during his second season at Highland.

Prior to taking over at Highland CC, Boyle spent two seasons as a graduate manager at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and in 2013-14 helped the program earn a berth in the NCAA Tournament while also securing 21 wins.

During his playing career at Milwaukee, Boyle helped lead the Panthers to the Horizon League regular-season title and a bid to the National Invitation Tournament in 2010-11. That season, he posted 12.9 points per game while starting all 33 contests. In two seasons in Milwaukee, Boyle recorded 823 points and 149 three-point field goals.

After averaging 13.2 points and 3.1 rebounds per outing his first season at Milwaukee, the guard collected Second Team All-Horizon League and Horizon League All-Newcomer Team recognition before a back injury sidelined him for the 2009-10 campaign.

Boyle is a graduate of Milwaukee who also played two years at Highland CC.

Now in its 70th year, the Ohio Valley Conference continues to build on the success that has made it the nation's eighth-oldest NCAA Division I conference.

The OVC's proud past dates back to 1948, but seeds for the new league were actually planted in 1941. It was then that Roy Stewart, the athletics director at Murray State, Charles (Turkey) Hughes, the athletics director at Eastern Kentucky, and Kelly Thompson, the public relations director at Western Kentucky, first broached the idea of forming a new conference. Discussions were put on hold by World War II, but reemerged Feb. 27-28, 1948 at the Kentucky Hotel in Louisville as the three original institutions combined with Morehead State, Louisville and Evansville to form the OVC.

In the 1950's, the OVC became a pioneer on a much more significant scale socially. During times of racial segregation, league member Morehead State became one of the first non-traditionally black mid-southern institutions to accept a black student. In 1958, Marshall Banks earned athletically-related aid at Morehead, which signed a second black athlete, Howard Murphy, a year later. In 1961, Murphy earned all-conference recognition as a halfback in football. With racial barriers broken, the rest of the institutions in the league began to provide educational and athletic opportunities to African-Americans.

In 1955, the OVC became only the second six-member league nationally to earn an automatic bid to the prestigious NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, which, at that time, was limited to only 24 participants. The conference quickly proved worthy of that bid, as Morehead State defeated Marshall (107-92) and Wayne State (95-84) in the 1956 tournament.

Fifteen years later, former OVC member Western Kentucky became the first and only conference team to reach the Final Four. The Hilltoppers defeated Jacksonville, Kentucky and Ohio State before losing to Villanova in double overtime. WKU went on to finish in third place after beating Kansas 77-75 in the consolation game.

Since that time, the OVC has recorded some of the biggest upsets in the history of the NCAA Tournament. Perhaps the most famous moment came in 1987, when Austin Peay came from fourth place in the regular season to win the OVC Tournament and earn the league's automatic bid. The Governors drew powerful Illinois, and were such big underdogs, that ESPN broadcaster Dick Vitale promised to stand on his head if APSU won the game. After a 68-67 victory over the Illini, and a narrow 90-87 overtime loss to eventual Final Four participant Providence in the second round, Vitale made good on his promise in a visit to Clarksville two months later.

Murray State added to the OVC's string of upsets in 1988 when it knocked off 14th-ranked North Carolina State, 78-75. The Racers' M&M Boys - Jeff Martin and Don Mann - combined for 39 points in the win. MSU nearly went on to the Sweet 16 that year, losing to eventual national champion Kansas, 61-58. A bank shot by Mann that would've given the Racers a one-point lead rolled off the rim with three seconds left. In recent years, Murray State has dominated the OVC Tournament, reaching the championship game every year in the 1990's and winning the title seven times.

In recent years the OVC has broken onto the national scene as the league has sent a team into the second round of the NCAA Tournament in each of the past four seasons. In 2012 Murray State was undefeated and ranked in the nation's top ten until later in the season advancing to the round of 32 in the NCAA Tournament. In 2011 Morehead State made the second round with a first round upset over Louisville. Murray State advanced to the NCAA second round in 2010 while Morehead State won the NCAA first round play-in game in 2009.

The Ohio Valley Conference sponsors the following sports: baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis and track for men, and basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, track and volleyball for women. In addition, the OVC also sponsors the combined men's and women's sport of rifle.

Now in its 69th year the Ohio Valley Conference has grown significantly from its humble beginnings while increasing the number of athletics opportunities it provides for students. In 2008 Southern Illinois University Edwardsville joined the league replacing Samford University. In May of 2011 the league announced that Nashville based Belmont University would join the league for the 2012-13 season. Other current league representatives include charter members Eastern Kentucky University, Morehead State University and Murray State University, along with Austin Peay State University, Eastern Illinois University, Jacksonville State University, Southeast Missouri State University, Tennessee State University, Tennessee Technological University and the University of Tennessee at Martin.

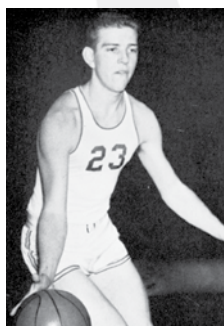
Eastern Illinois basketball celebrated 100 years of intercollegiate basketball during the 2009-10 season. Listed below are the ten individuals selected as members of the Panthers All-Century team. They were honored during the Panthers final home game of the 2009-10 season on Feb. 27 against Tennessee State.



Andy Sullivan (1942-46) was a two-time team captain during the World War II era playing for Coach Pim Goff. He was a three time All-Illinois Intercollegiate Athletic Conference selection and named league MVP in 1945 after leading the IIAAC in scoring.



Tom Katsimpalis (1949-52) was a second team All-American in 1950 and a key member of the Panthers 1952 NAIA team. He was a three-time first team All-IIAC selection and held the single game, season and career scoring records at the time of his graduation. He scored 1,538 points and currently ranks 7th all-time at EIU. He was the first EIU player selected by the National Basketball Association as he was selected in the 7th round of the 1952 draft by the Minneapolis Lakers.



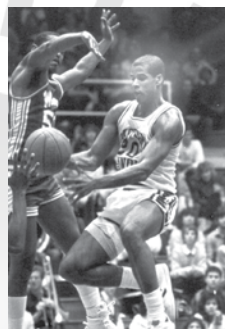
John Milholland (1956-58) held the EIU career scoring record for more than 30 years with 1,655 career points. He was a key member of the Panthers 1957 NAIA team. A three-time first team All-IIAC selection he still holds the EIU record for season field goals made at 284 and is second in career scoring average. He currently ranks 5th on the Panthers career scoring list.



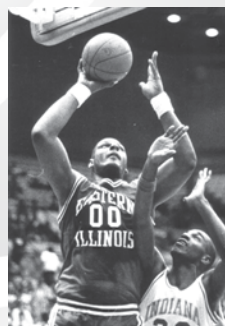
Charlie Thomas (1975-78) was a catalyst for the Panthers 1976 and 1978 NCAA Division II teams appearing in the second most games of any player in Panther history. His 1,452 career points rank 8th all-time on the EIU list while he holds the school record for consecutive free throws made with 54, set during the 1978 season. He ranks third on the EIU career free throw percentage list.



Craig DeWitt (1977-80) was a rebounding and scoring threat twice earning NCAA Division II All-American honors. He was a member of the 1978 NCAA Division II team and the first EIU player to earn All-Mid-Continent Conference honors in 1980. He is one of only three players to rank in the EIU career Top 10 for both scoring and rebounding. His 1,426 career points rank 9th while his 684 rebounds place him 6th.



Jon Collins (1983-86) was one of the most decorated players in EIU history twice being named the Mid-Continent Conference Player of the Year in 1985 and 1986. He was a two-time All-American helping the Panthers win the 1985 Mid-Con Conference Tournament. He ended his career as the Panthers career leading scorer with 1,702 points which now ranks 4th all-time. He was a 5th round selection of the Denver Nuggets in the 1986 NBA Draft.



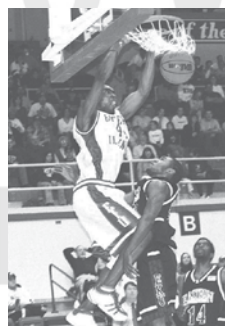
Kevin Duckworth (1983-86) has been the most identifiable player in Eastern Illinois basketball history. A force in the low post he was named first team All-Mid-Continent Conference in 1986. He ended his playing days as the EIU and Mid-Con career leader in rebounds with 867. He also holds the EIU record for career blocks at 123 and ranks third in career field goal percentage. One of three players to rank in the career Top 10 for rebounding and scoring he is 6th with 1,569 career points. A second round NBA draft pick in 1986 he went on to become a two-time NBA All-Star with the Portland Trailblazers.



Jay Taylor (1986-89) had a knack for scoring as he twice earned All-American honors while playing for the Panthers. He ended his career as the EIU career leading scorer with 1,926 points, a total that now ranks 2nd. He was named the 1989 Mid-Continent Conference Player of the Year averaging 23.4 points per game which ranks 4th on the EIU single season list. He is second in career free throws made with 553. Taylor signed as a NBA free agent with the New Jersey Nets.

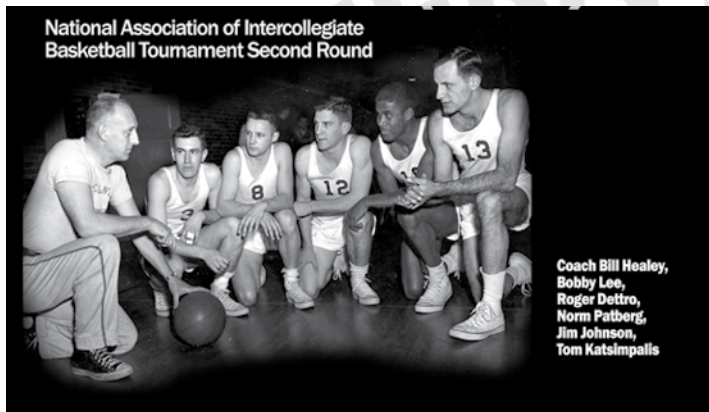


Kyle Hill (1998-2001) helped lead EIU to the 2001 NCAA Division I Tournament as he ranked second in the nation in scoring at 23.8 points per game. He finished his career with 211 3-points and ranks 3rd on the career scoring list with 1,819 points. He was a two-time first team All-Ohio Valley Conference selection. A versatile guard, Hill ranks third in career assists and second in career steals. He was a second round draft pick of the Dallas Mavericks and is currently playing professionally in Europe.

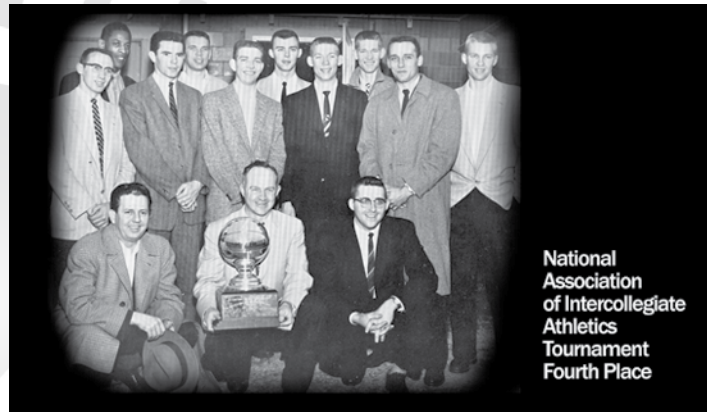


Henry Domercant (2000-03) smashed the EIU and Ohio Valley Conference record books with his scoring prowess. He ranks first in career scoring for the school and conference with 2,602 points having playing in the most games in Panther history at 120. He was a member of the 2001 NCAA Tournament team and was the 2002 OVC Player of the Year earning All-America honors. Three times in his career Domercant ranked in the Top 5 in the nation in scoring as he finished fifth in 2001 and second in both 2002 and 2003. He will be elected to the EIU athletic hall of fame this October and is currently playing professionally in Europe.

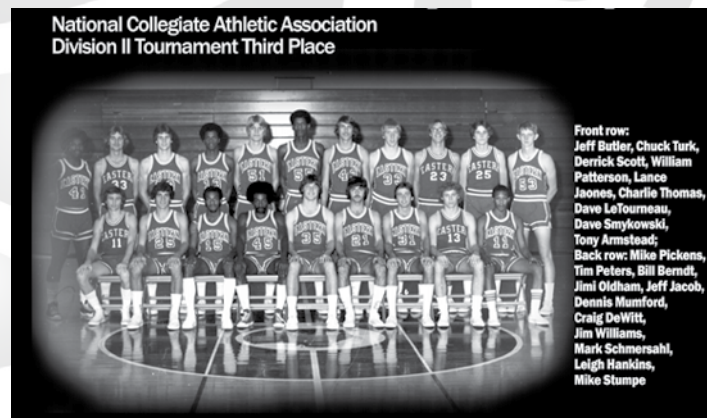
1952 – The Panthers posted a 22-0 regular-season record to become the only EIU team with an unblemished regular season mark. EIU would go 1-1 in the NAIA District Championships suffering its first loss to Millikin. The Panthers still earned a berth in the NAIA National Tournament going 1-1 to end the season at 24-2 overall. The team was coached by Bill Healy with Tom Katsimpalis the team captain.



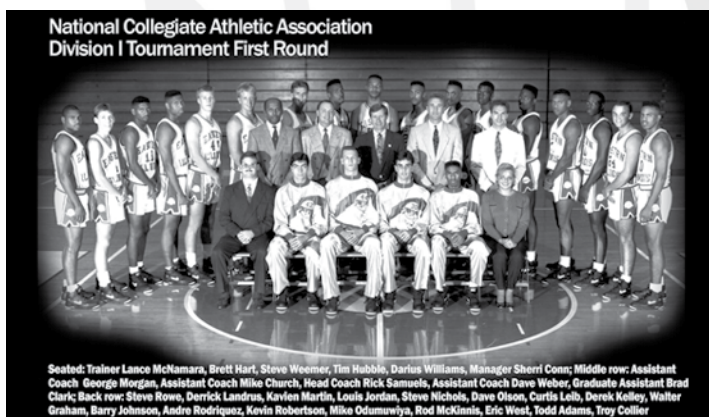
1957 – The Panthers made a late season surge to earn a spot in the NAIA District playoffs where they defeated McKendree and Millikin to win the championship. The team would advance to the NAIA National Tournament winning their first three games to advance to the NAIA National Semifinals. They would fall to Southeastern Oklahoma in the semifinals and then lost to Pacific Southern in the consolation game to finish fourth in the nation. Robert Carey coached the team with Lloyd Ludwig the team captain.



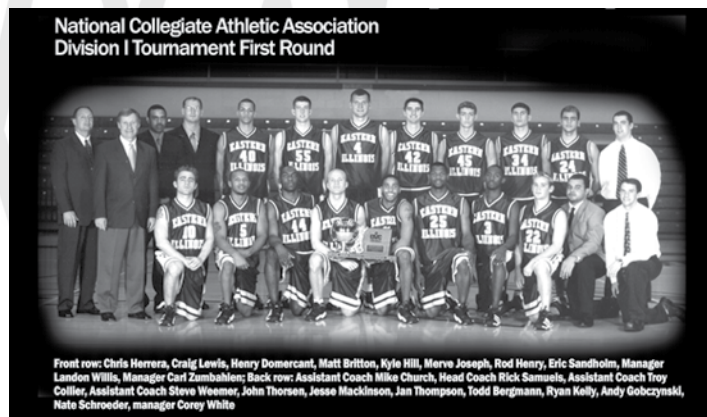
1976 – The Panthers made a splash on the national scene as they won the NCAA Division II Great Lakes Regional with wins over St. Joseph's and Evansville. EIU would advance to the Elite Eight defeating Bridgeport in the opening round. The Panthers fell to UT Chattanooga in the national semifinals but rebounded to defeat Old Dominion and place third in the nation in NCAA Division II. Don Eddy coached the team with Brad Warble the team captain.



1978 – The Panthers again advanced deep into the NCAA Division II playoffs as they again defeated St. Joseph's and Evansville to win the Great Lakes Regional. EIU would defeat Elizabeth City in the Elite Eight to advance to their second national semifinal in three seasons. The Panthers lost to UW Green Bay in the semifinal contest but rebounded to defeat Florida Tech in the consolation game for a NCAA Division II 3rd place finish. Don Eddy coached the team with Derrick Scott the team captain.

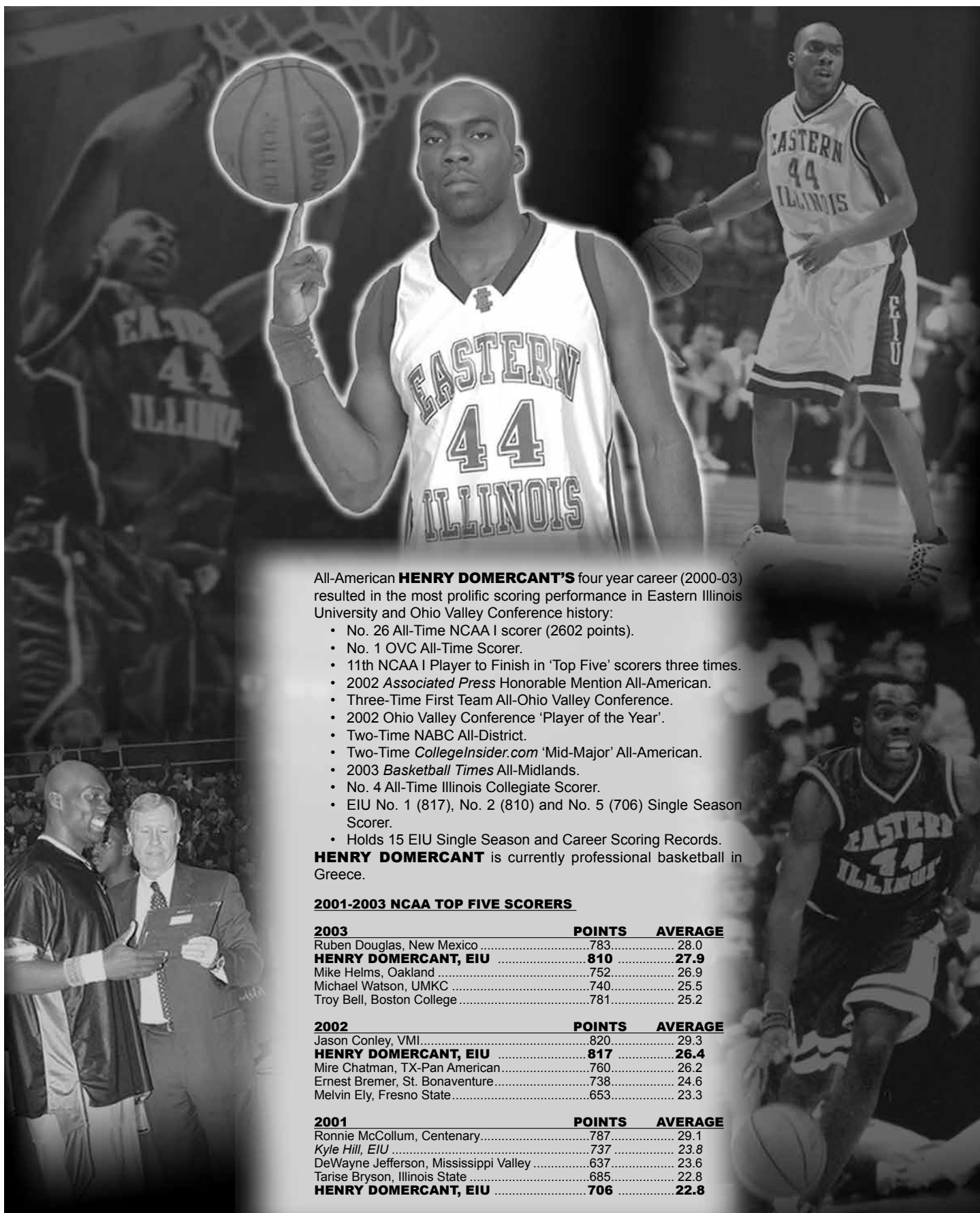


1992 – The Panthers ran through the Mid-Continent Conference Tournament winning three straight games over Wright State, UW Green Bay and Illinois-Chicago to secure their first-ever NCAA Division I Tournament appearance. EIU had entered the Mid-Con Tournament as the four seed. Their reward was as trip to Boise, Idaho where they faced Indiana in the NCAA Tournament first round. Rick Samuels coached the team with Dave Olson the team captain.



2001 – The Panthers were led by two of the nation's top scorers in Kyle Hill and Henry Domercant as they placed second in the Ohio Valley Conference regular-season race. EIU defeated Murray State in the opening round and advanced to their second NCAA Tournament with a memorable championship game win over Austin Peay. The Panthers landed in the Kansas City Regional where they played Arizona. Rick Samuels coached the team with Kyle Hill, Matt Britton and Merv Joseph team captains.

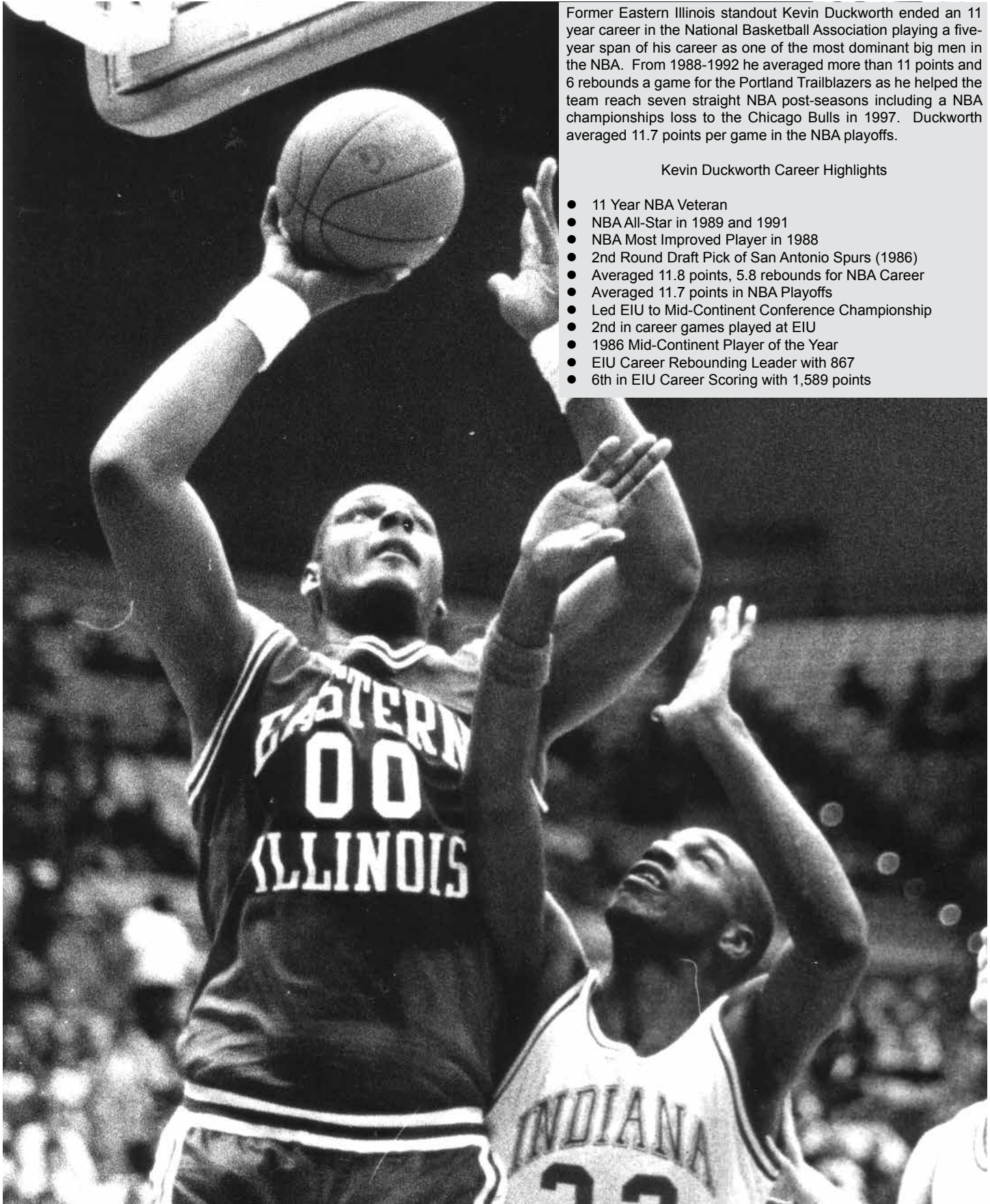

NBA ALL-STAR KEVIN DUCKWORTH



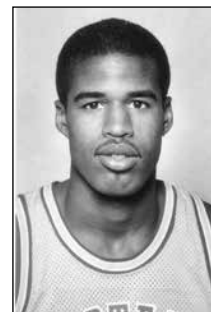
Former Eastern Illinois standout Kevin Duckworth ended an 11 year career in the National Basketball Association playing a five-year span of his career as one of the most dominant big men in the NBA. From 1988-1992 he averaged more than 11 points and 6 rebounds a game for the Portland Trailblazers as he helped the team reach seven straight NBA post-seasons including a NBA championships loss to the Chicago Bulls in 1997. Duckworth averaged 11.7 points per game in the NBA playoffs.

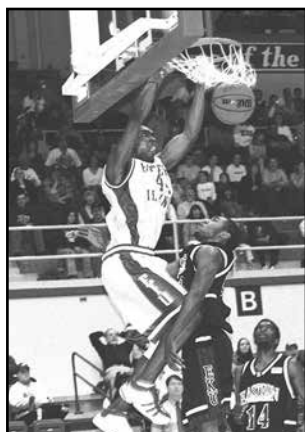
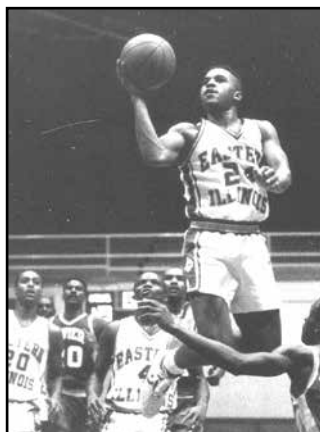

"You coach this sport with a dream to get to the NCAA tournament... athletes play this sport with a dream to reach the NCAA tournament... and here at Eastern Illinois University ... dreams do come true!"

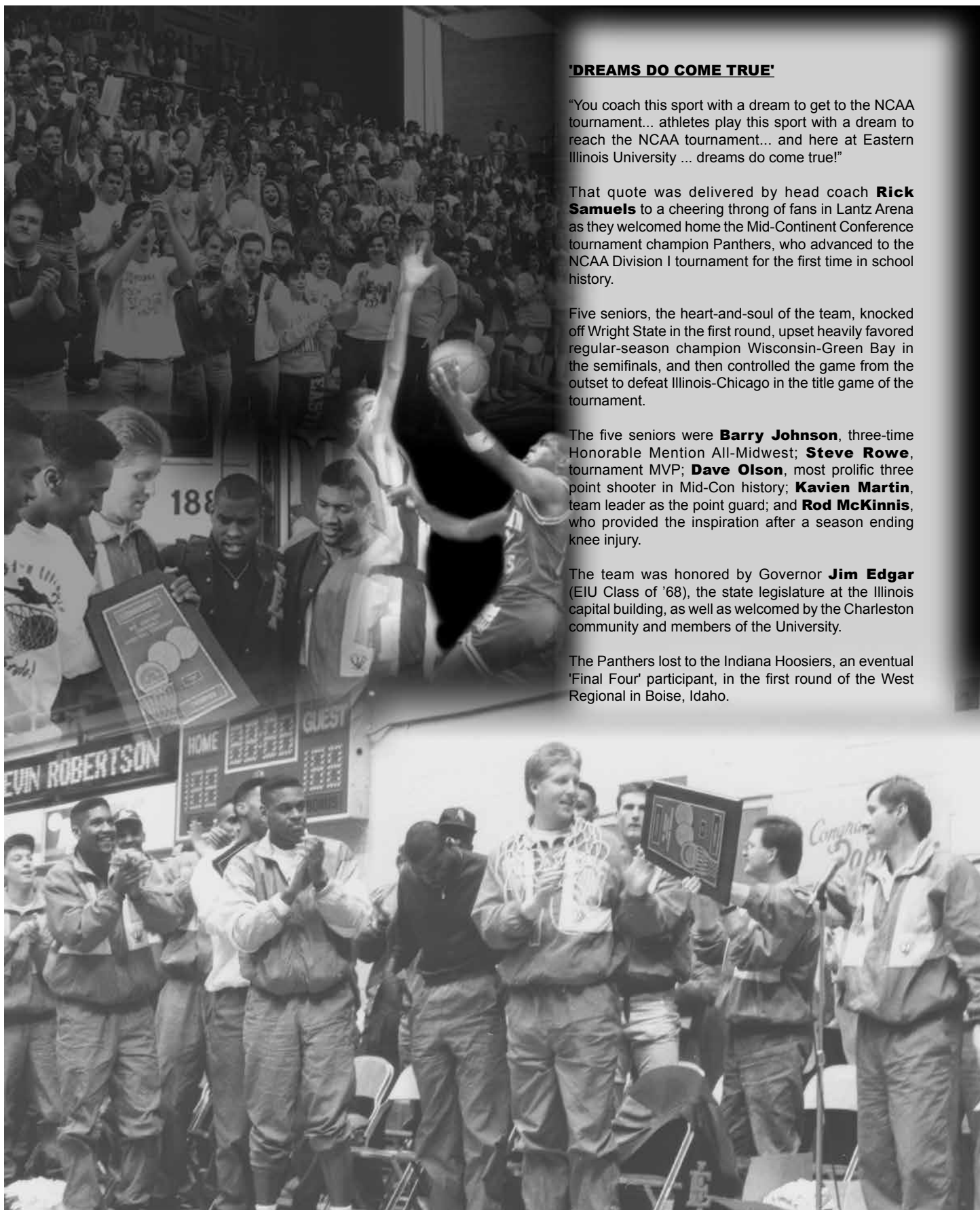
That quote was delivered by head coach **Rick Samuels** to a cheering throng of fans in Lantz Arena as they welcomed home the Mid-Continent Conference tournament champion Panthers, who advanced to the NCAA Division I tournament for the first time in school history.

Five seniors, the heart-and-soul of the team, knocked off Wright State in the first round, upset heavily favored regular-season champion Wisconsin-Green Bay in the semifinals, and then controlled the game from the outset to defeat Illinois-Chicago in the title game of the tournament.

The five seniors were **Barry Johnson**, three-time Honorable Mention All-Midwest; **Steve Rowe**, tournament MVP; **Dave Olson**, most prolific three point shooter in Mid-Con history; **Kavien Martin**, team leader as the point guard; and **Rod McKinnis**, who provided the inspiration after a season ending knee injury.

The team was honored by Governor **Jim Edgar** (EIU Class of '68), the state legislature at the Illinois capital building, as well as welcomed by the Charleston community and members of the University.

The Panthers lost to the Indiana Hoosiers, an eventual 'Final Four' participant, in the first round of the West Regional in Boise, Idaho.

CRASHING THE 'BIG DANCE' **... A HISTORIC TIMELINE**

JANUARY 6

Coach **Rick Samuels** won his 300th career game as EIU nipped Tennessee State, 99-98, in Nashville behind senior **Kyle Hill's** 22 points.

FEBRUARY 3

It was standing room only in Lantz as over 5,000 screaming fans witnessed **Kyle Hill's** last-second basket lift the Panthers past Austin Peay, 80-78.

FEBRUARY 27

EIU went undefeated at home for the first time in 50 years as the Panthers defeated Morehead State, 102-80, in a first-round game of the OVC tournament.

MARCH 2

The Panthers became the first team in 11 years to keep Murray State out of the OVC tournament championship game by winning the semifinal, 97-71.

MARCH 3

In one of the most dramatic comebacks in collegiate history, the Panthers roared back from an 18-point deficit in the final six minutes to win the OVC tournament championship with an 84-83 victory over arch-rival Austin Peay... sophomore **Jan Thompson** scored the winning last-second basket on a 'goaltending' call.

MIDNIGHT ON MARCH 4

Over 2,000 fans poured into Lantz Arena to honor the NCAA-bound Panthers with a victory celebration.

MARCH 16

Despite **Kyle Hill's** 32-points, No. 2 Arizona (the eventual national runner-up) ended the 15th-seeded Panthers' trip to the NCAA tournament in the Midwest Regional at Kansas City's Kemper Arena.





1948-49: The Panthers won 23 games enroute to the NAIB national finals.



1952-53: Eastern celebrates its 50th straight win in old Lantz Gym (now McAfee Gym) as the streak eventually reached 52 before a loss.



1951-52: Eastern set a school record with 24 wins and were 23-0 before losing to Millikin in the NAIA District 20. By special invitation the Panthers were invited to the NAIB Tournament where they were eliminated by Morningside (IA) in the second round.



1956-57: A late season surge propelled the Panthers to the NAIA District 20 title and a fourth place finish at the NAIA National Championship in Kansas City.

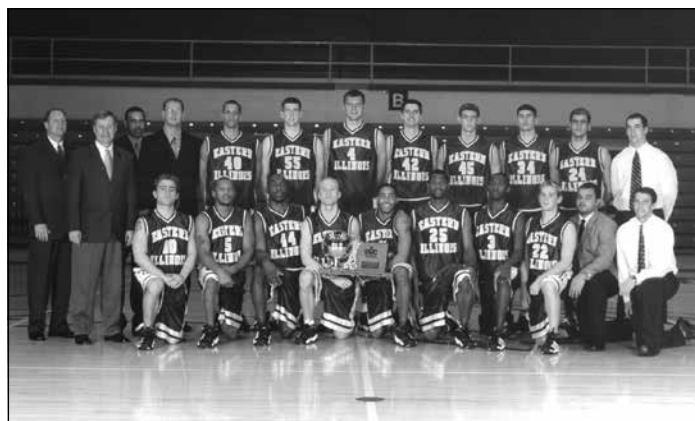

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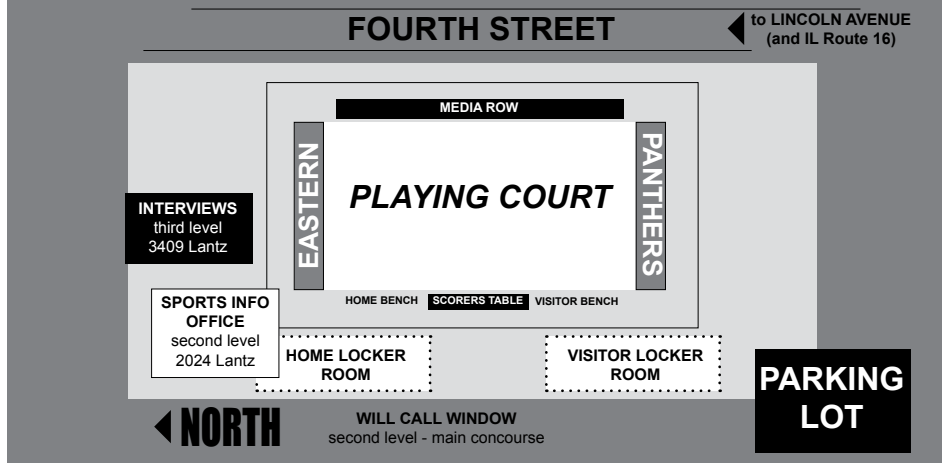


LANTZ ARENA LAYOUT
